Dog Walking

Fire Pit Inspections

The snow is finally gone, and the evenings are starting to warm up, which means it will soon be time for sitting around the fire pit in the back yard. Remember that as set out in Bylaw No. 9-2004, citizens are required to have all <u>new</u> fire pits inspected by the fire department. Fire pit inspections must be booked prior to June 28th, 2019. Garbage Pick Up

Please be reminded that as of May 1st, 2019 anyone who regularly moves their garbage from the front to the back alley for pick up is required to do so until October 31st, 2019 regardless of the amount of snow we have received. This change will take effect at these times each year.

Building Permits

With the building and renovation season starting up, the Town of Preeceville would like to remind everyone that development and building permits are required for most new construction projects which include renovations to existing buildings and for changes of buildings or land use, this includes sheds, tarp sheds, decks and fences.
