Karen Pence, Second Lady of the United States, and former Indiana First Lady, was keynote speaker.


An award-winning water-color artist and former teacher, Pence's primary focus as Second Lady is to raise awareness of and to educate the public about the mental health profession of art therapy in the U.S. and around the world.
