A Curriculum In FAMILY LIFE AND SEXUAL HEALTH For Middle & High School Students With Special Needs

While visuals are embedded in some of the lessons, they have also been pulled out and separately indexed in PowerPoint format to make it easier to access and print.

This is a curriculum designed by the Public Health – Seattle & King County, Family Planning Program. It consists of twenty-eight lesson plans for the self-contained special needs classroom in a middle or high school. There are also F.L.A.S.H. curricula for use in mainstream classes in grades 4-12. The goals of FLASH are to assist in the development of persons: • who are knowledgeable about human development and reproduction, • who respect and appreciate themselves, their families and all persons, • who will neither exploit others nor allow themselves to be exploited.
