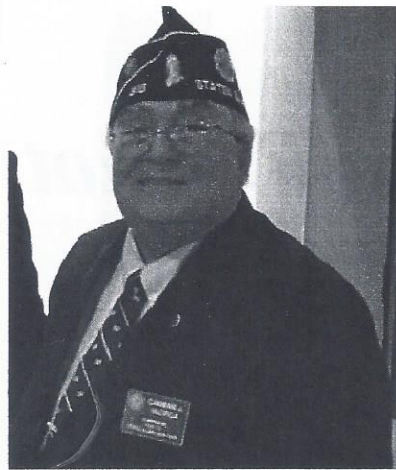

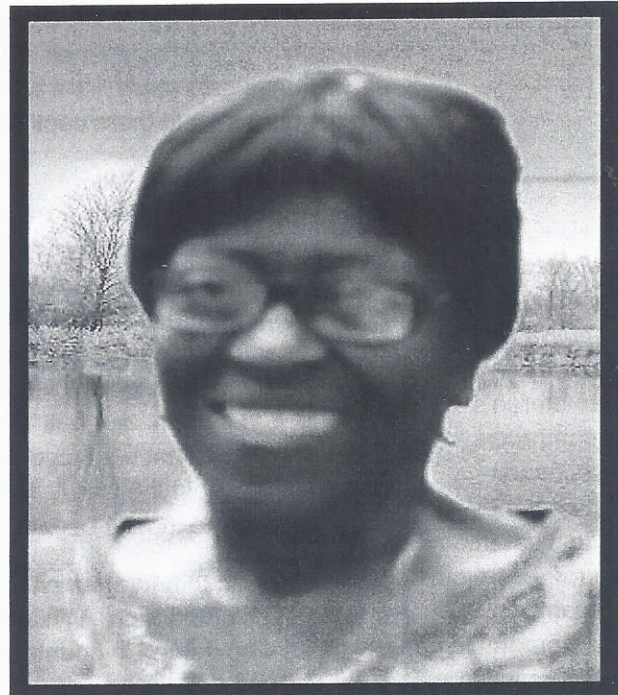

Vietnam Veterans Day 2019

When the last combat troops left Vietnam On March 29, 1973 after a little more than ten years of fighting 2,7 million troops had served in country and another 6 million in other capacities during the war. None could self-determine where they were to be stationed, and each deserves our thanks. Those who served in country experienced unique hardships that only comes with service in a combat zone, now almost 50 years later only 850,000 of those who served are still estimated to be alive. These brave men and women that served have no shame, for it was the sins of the nation that held them captive for all these years.

For so many years after our return home for many the battle scars remained, the friends we left behind and then so many were getting sick and dying from the chemicals that our own nation used on us. They said we lost the war but in the minds of so many we did not lose. We had won every major battle fought in those 10 years. Those that sent us there are the ones that truly lost the war. It was not until the mid-80's that the thanks began to surface.

All were called to serve. which every veteran understands and honors. While we recognize all, those who served in country deserve our special appreciation.

We are the Veterans that served in and during the Vietnam War. We were from all walks of life. We were from big cities and small towns across the nation we were from many different ethnic backgrounds, but we loved and cared about each other.

This year we celebrate the 11th anniversary of March 29th Vietnam Veterans Day in New York State all because of Senator Andrew Lanza and former Assemblyman Matt Titone

In 2008 Vietnam Veterans were finally recognized for their service in New York State with passing of Senate Bill 6472 introduced by Senator Andrew Lanza permanently declaring March 29th as Vietnam Veterans Day in New York State, Thirty-five years after the last Combat Troops left South Vietnam. It had only taken six months for March 29th to be recognized as Vietnam Veterans Day in NY State but nearly fifty years for all the Vietnam Veterans to be recognized by our Nation.

On March 28, 2017 by an act of Congress and signed by President Trump March 29th Vietnam Veterans Day became known as a National Day of Remembrance and publicly thanking them with Honor and Dignity and truly recognizing their sacrifices that they all deserved.

County Celebrates 100 Years

The Richmond County American Legion celebrated The American Legion's 100th birthday on Friday, March 15, with dinner and dancing at Li Greci's Staaten at 6 P.M. It was a formal affair.

The Centennial Celebration included several hundred veterans, officers, active military, family members and friends gathered to raise their glasses to toast this milestone. Posts present included members of the James J. Tappen Post 125, the Watkins-Kellett Post No. 277, the Granito-Smith Post No. 1296, Gold Star Post No. 1365, H & S Cichon Post No. 1578, Pvt. Joseph Merrell Jr. Post No. 1368, the Beauvais-Hudson Post No. 126, the Kells-Grennie Post No. 316, the Patrick J. Dalessio Post No. 1310, the Huttner-Pasqualini Post No. 1367, and the Cespino-Russo Post No. 1544.

The County is about continuing the organization's legacy of service. County Commander Anthony G. DeNatale, said, "The American Legion's vision of advocating for a strong national defense, veteran rehabilitation, promoting a 100 percent Americanism and establishing programs that give our children and youth a foundation for future success, is as important today as it was to the World War I veterans who formed this great organization."

"Our commitment to these ideals will continue into the next 100 years and beyond. Our determination and commitment will only grow stronger to support the next generation of American veterans," he said.



A Short Legion History

A group of 20 officers who served in the American Expeditionary Forces (AEF) in France during World War I are credited with founding the Legion. AEF Headquarters then asked officers to suggest ideas on how to improve troop morale.

Lt. Col. Theodore Roosevelt Jr. proposed an organization of veterans. In February 1919, the group formed a temporary committee and selected several hundred officers who had the confidence and respect of the entire army.

About 1,000 officers and enlisted men attended the Paris Caucus in March 1919. They adopted a temporary Constitution and named it The American Legion.

The group also elected an executive committee to complete the organization's work. It considered each soldier of the AEF a member of the Legion. The executive committee named a subcommittee to organize veterans at home in the United States

In May 1919, the Legion held a second organizing caucus in St. Louis. It completed the constitution and made plans for a permanent organization, setting up a temporary headquarters in New York City and beginning its relief, employment and Americanism programs.

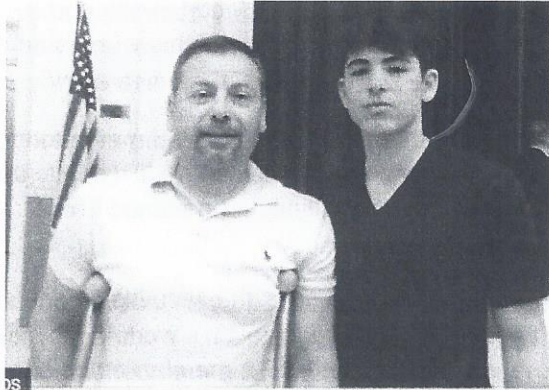
Congress would then grant the Legion a national charter in September 1919.



This Post came into existence in 1919 following the end of WW I and was named for Edward W. Kells who was killed in WWI.

Joe was also a member of the American Legion Kells-Grennie Post in New Dorp, Staten Island where he served for many years as Vice Commander and Membership Chairman.

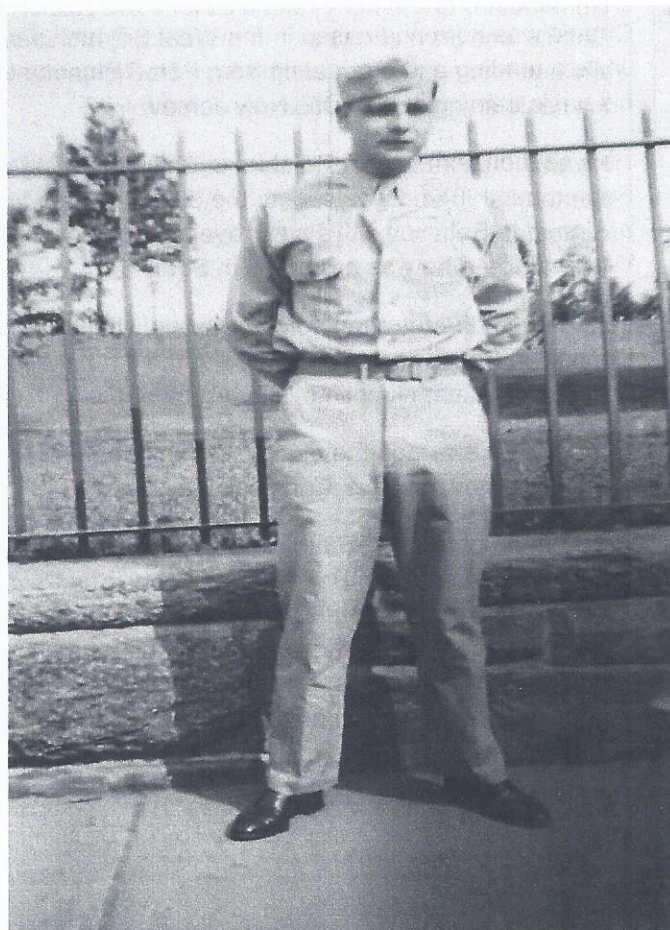

Charles W. Goffredo

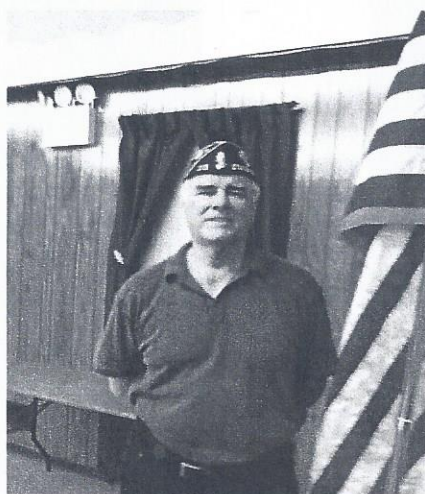
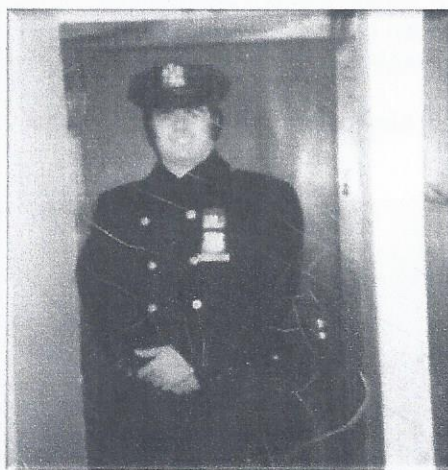
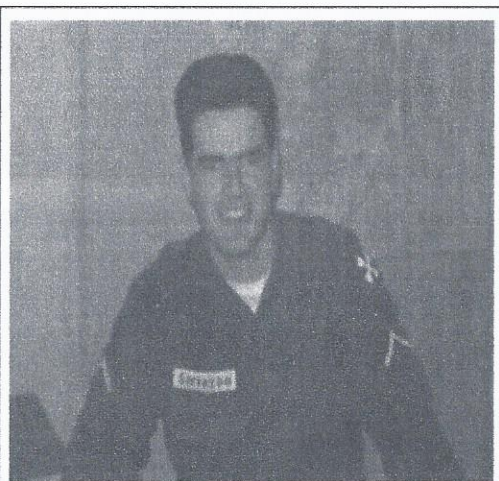
Charles W. Goffredo (the warden) has been a member of the American Legion for thirty-seven years and served as a Vice-Commander of the Kells-Grennie American Legion Post 316 from 2010 – 2017 and is currently the Americanism Chairman. Charlie was born and raised in the West Brighton section of Staten Island. In his early years he worked as a meat cutter while attending and graduating from Port Richmond High School in 1964. Entered the U.S. Army in January 1965 and did his basic training at Fort Dix, New Jersey.

He was then sent to Fort Holabird in Baltimore Maryland and trained as a Military Intelligence Coordinator and analyst. In September 1965 he was sent to the 502nd Military Intelligence, 8th Army Seoul, South Korea. In April 1967 he was assigned to Battalion HQ's and traveling from the DMZ to the Southern tip of Korea mostly with Senior Intelligence officers. While in Korea he was promoted to Sgt E-5.

Later in 1967 he returned home on leave where he married his High School sweetheart Jean and was assigned to the Presidio in San Francisco attached to the 115th Military Intelligence Group, 6th Army for twelve months. He was assigned as the permanent night time Duty Agent at Group HQ's

Charles was awarded the Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Korean Defense medal and the New York Conspicuous Cross.

He returned home in 1968 to work as a butcher for the A & P. attending St John's University and New York Institute of Technology majoring in Behavioral Science and Psychology. Charlie then joined the NYPD. His first assignment was to the 1st Pct. Manhattan South Task Force and then to Brooklyn South Narcotics. Subsequently he worked the Manhattan South Narcotics Organized Crime Control Bureau as an Investigator/Detective wiretap specialist. He later retired from the NYPD and began a second career as a Real-estate Broker. Charlie has three children and seven grand children including grandson Charles IV also an army veteran and member of the Kells-Grennie American Legion Post.

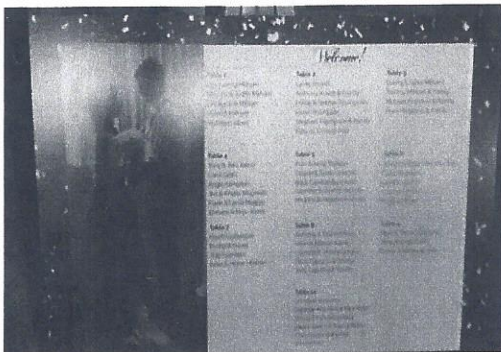
Every issue of the News letter we will feature a member of the Post with two pictures Now - a present picture and Then - a picture in when they were in the military.
