
Pastor's Message

In the Christian Book Club, we aim to delve into thought-provoking Christian literature, bolster our faith, and enhance our understanding of applying Scripture. Our initial book selection is *A Voice in the Wind*, Book 1 of Francine Rivers' Mark of the Lion Series. This Christian Historical Fiction Novel is set in first-century Rome and promises engaging discussions and spiritual growth. If you were inspired by *The Hiding Place* and *In His Steps*, you will find this fall's reading list equally uplifting.

The Monthly Pastor's Luncheon serves as a platform for folk to connect, share experiences, and enjoy a meal together. Dates and times will be posted on the UPC Facebook page and announced during regular services. This year's theme is **Sharpening Our Swords: Rightly Dividing the Word**.

Think of Thursday evening's midweek service as a midweek recharge. The hybrid service is streamed via YouTube. By the end of September, we will complete our inductive study of the Gospel of Mark.

Understanding that everyone has varying schedules and preferences, we offer early morning devotions, Monday through Friday at 6:00 am, via Zoom—a quiet time to center ourselves in God's presence. Starting this month, we will spend a few minutes each session reading from Brother Lawrence's *The Practice of the Presence of God*. These moments of reflection and prayer will help us purposefully begin our weekdays.

We remain committed to enhancing people's quality of life by providing goods and services off-site to marginalized individuals at the requests of the primary agencies that serve them. The Newark YW/YMCA, AristaCare at Norwood Terrace, and the Dudley House residents are the agencies we continue working with. We work with other agen-


cies to distribute food to local pantries and, on occasion, individuals.


Sunday School Classes:

Why do we celebrate Labor Day?

In 2024, Labor Day falls on Monday, Sept. 2nd

Rooted in the labor movement of the 19th century, the holiday originated during a dismal time for America's workers, who faced long hours, low wages and unsafe conditions.

As labor unions and activists advocated and fought for better treatment for workers at the height of the Industrial Revolution, the idea arose to establish a day dedicated to celebrating the members of trade and labor unions, according to History.com.

Even today, many Americans continue to celebrate Labor Day with parades and parties – festivities outlined in the first proposal for a holiday, according to the U.S. Department of Labor. Since those early celebrations, Labor Day is now also marked with speeches by elected officials and community leaders who emphasize the economic and civic significance of the holiday.

Organized by the Central Labor Union, the first Labor Day holiday was celebrated in 1882 in New York City, according to the labor department. On that day, 10,000 workers took unpaid time off to march from City Hall to Union Square.

New York was also the first state to introduce a bill recognizing Labor Day, but Oregon was the first to pass such a law in 1887, according to the labor department. By 1894, 32 states had adopted the holiday.

Patriot Day

September 11, 2024



Patriot Day is a national observance that honors the memory of those who were killed in the September 11 attacks in the United States. On September 11, 2001 al-Qaeda launched a

series of coordinated terrorist attacks upon the United States, killing almost 3,000 people. In the immediate aftermath of the tragic events, the President proclaimed September 14, 2001 as a National Day of Prayer and Remembrance for the Victims of the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. A year later, September 11 was made a national day of mourning referred to as Patriot Day. This observance has been proclaimed annually since 2002.

In 2009, the President rededicated it as Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance. It is not a public holiday therefore government offices, educational institutions and businesses do not close on this day. On Patriot Day, the national flag is flown at half-mast on all United States government buildings and establishments. Individuals are also encouraged to display flags on their homes.

A moment of silence is traditionally observed at 8:46 AM. Many organizations and establishments hold memorial ceremonies to honor the victims of 9/11.

The International Day of Peace September 21st

2024 Theme: Cultivating a Culture of Peace

The International Day of Peace ("Peace Day") is observed around the world each year on 21 September. Established in 1981 by unanimous United Nations resolution, Peace Day provides a globally shared date for all humanity to commit to Peace above all differences and to contribute to building a Culture of Peace.

This year marks the 25th anniversary of the United Nations General Assembly's adoption of the Declaration and Programme of Action on a Culture of Peace.

In that declaration, the United Nations' most inclusive body recognized that peace "not only is the absence of conflict, but also requires a positive, dynamic participatory process where dialogue is encouraged and conflicts are solved in a spirit of mutual understanding and cooperation."

In a world with rising geopolitical tensions and protracted conflicts, there has never been a better time to remember how the UN General Assembly came together in 1999 to lay out the values needed



for a culture of peace. These include: respect for life, human rights and fundamental freedoms; the promotion of non-violence through education, dialogue and cooperation; commitment to peaceful settlement of conflicts; and adherence to freedom, justice, democracy, tolerance, solidarity, cooperation, pluralism, cultural diversity, dialogue and understanding at all levels of society and among nations.

In follow-up resolutions, the General Assembly recognized further the importance of choosing *negotiations over confrontation and of working together and not against each other*.

The Constitution of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (<u>UNESCO</u>) starts with the notion that "wars begin in the minds of men so it is in the minds of men that the defences of peace must be constructed". It is this notion that framed the theme and logo of this year's observance of the International Day of Peace. The ideas of peace, the culture of peace, need to be cultivated in the minds of children and communities through formal and informal education, across countries and generations.

The International Day of Peace has always been a time to lay down weapons and observe ceasefires. But it now must also be a time for people to see each other's humanity. Our survival as a global community depends on that.







CHILDREN'S CORNER

Parents, please read this to your younger child(ren)

Playing Favorites

Theme: God tells us not to favor certain people over others.

Object: A large box of used crayons

Scripture: James 2:1-10

What kinds of things come to mind when you think of back-to-school time? (Pause.) One school supply that many of you need when you go back to school is a box of crayons. (Show the box of crayons.)

I have many crayons here, and they're all different sizes and colors. Some are sharp and some are dull. Some have strange-sounding names. Some are like-new and others have been used quite a bit. The wrappers are fresh on some, while others are torn and dirty.



We can learn a lot from these crayons. Even though they may have differences, they all fit very nicely in the same box. That's a good picture of the way the church should be. The people that make up the church come in all sizes and colors, and some may even have names that sound different from yours. Some are old and some are young. Some are dressed in very nice clothes, while others may wear clothing that is dirty and worn.

Have you ever noticed people being treated differently because they did not look or act like others? (Pause.)

James, the brother of Jesus, wrote in the Bible that the followers of Jesus should not show favoritism, or treat one person better than someone else. He said, "My friends, if you have faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, you won't treat some people better than others." James explained that if a rich person wearing fancy clothes and a gold ring comes to one of your meetings and a poor person dressed in worn-out clothes also comes, you must not give the best seat to the one in fancy clothes and tell the one who is poor to stand at the side or sit on the floor. That is the same as saying that some people are better than others, which the Bible says is wrong.

We must be careful not to show favoritism in our church or anywhere else. We're all God's children, whether we're rich or poor, or of any kind of race. As James said, "You will do all right if you obey the most important law in the Scriptures. It's the law that commands us to love others as much as we love ourselves."

PRAYER:

Dear God, please help us to love one another as You have loved usshowing us how every person is adored by You. We don't want to play favorites with Your people. In Jesus' name, amen.




