THE ECUMENICAL MAN-MADE-BIBLE

Because the Bible God wrote according to 2 Peter 2:1-2 Eph 5:11 teaches DIVISION (between professors and possessors of saving faith), the Ecumenical Church must replace it with a "MAN-MADE-BIBLE," in which all objectional doctrines have been removed. A Bible that answers this description is said to be well on it's way.

THE EVOLVING ECUMENICAL BIBLE

Current, conflicting and confusing Bible Versions and Paraphrases appear to be part of a "BRAIN-WASHING" process, to prepare both clergy and laity for the reception of the new "EVOLVING BIBLE."

A recent magazine article tells about agents operating within the World ecumenical movement, who hve initiated the preparation of a new "Authorized Version" of the Holy Bible. This is evolving through the "BRAIN-WASHING" power of the translators who delete important Scriptures by saying they are not in the "best" Manuscripts. By "best' they refer to the codex Sinaiticus and Codex Vaticanus, which were elevated to the "Chair of Authority" through the deceptive teaching of Westcott and Hort (1). Codex Sinaiticus was found in the monastery of St. Catherine at Mt. Sinai in 1844 by Constantin Tischendorf, a German Biblical professor. For the most part Codex Sinaiticus is in agreement with Codex Vaticanus. Several good authorities believe these are two extant copies of the 50 Greek Scriptures copied for Constantine by Eusebius in 331 A.D. (2).

ECUMENICAL BIBLE TO DISPLACE KING JAMES BIBLE

This new Evolving Bible is to be the Bible of the UNIVERSAL CHURCH of WORLD BROTHERHOOD. It will go beyond anything we have seen yet, for we are told that it will "delete" (blot out) every trace of the story of Christ's crucifixion, whereby He died for the sins of who will believe. More than this, plans are being made by which this UNIVERSAL CHURCH BIBLE will supplant (take the place of) both the Douay and King James Bibles. Already, before our very eyes, we see both the clergy and laity turning away from the King James and turning to various new versions and paraphrases which omit portions of God's word which are essential for salvation. The "FAITH" that saves can be no more perfect than the word of God from which it comes. (See Romans 10:17). The preaching of the "CROSS" is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God (I Cor. 1:18). But unto the wicked God Saith. "What hast thou to do to declare my statutes, or that thou shouldest take my covenant in thy mouth? Seeing thou hatest instruction, and casteth my words behind thee," (Psalm 50:16-17.)

The Power Of The Holy Ghost

The Holy Ghost is one of the Gods in the Triune Godhead. He has always been equal with God and with Christ. The King James version of Genesis 1:1 reads, "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth." The Hebrew word for God in this place is Elohim which is the plural form of Eloah. This plurality appears in many of our scriptures denoting three persons in the Godhead. The creation story says, "Let us make man in our image." When the people were building the Tower of Babel, Genesis 11:7, the Bible says, "Let us go down and confound their language." It is also interesting to note among the scriptures showing the plurality of the Godhead is the one in Genesis 18:1-8. This is the one with the story of three men coming to talk with Abraham. Verse 2 states there were three men yet Abraham spoke to them as though he was speaking to one. The same plural term, Elohim, is used when Abraham was speaking to Abimelech in Genesis 20:13, "When God (Elohim) caused me to wonder from my Father's house.' There are many more scriptures, especially in the Old Testament, where the plural term of God is used. They have always been equal, working unitedly as one.

When the time came for a Redeemer to come to this earth to make the plan of salvation possible, one of these three, through the power of the Holy Ghost, became incarnated to become the Son of God and born of Mary. In Luke 1:26-35 we read this was through the power of the Holy Ghost as well as the power of God. Jesus came to give His life on the cross and in the shedding of His blood made the sacrifice, as the Lamb of God, for our sins but the other two of the Triune Godhead, working through Jesus, now called "The Son of God" also have their part in the total plan of man's redemption from the fall which came through the sin of Adam. 1 John 5:7 reads, "For there are three that bear record in heaven, The Father, the Word (Jesus), and the Holy Ghost: and these three are One. "Another translation would read "these three are united." They all work as One toward the redemption of man from sin.

We read in John 14:16, 17, "And I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you forever; even the Spirit of Truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth Him not, neither knoweth Him: but ye know Him: for He dwelleth with you, and shall be in you." Then in verse 26 of the same chapter, "But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, He will teach you all things, and bring all things to your rememberance, what so ever I have said unto you."

As the time drew near for Jesus, The Annointed One, to return to the throne of God, Hebrews 12:2, He began preparing the disciples to receive the One who would be following Him. He said, "Nevertheless I tell you the truth; it is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send Him unto you. And when He is come, He will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: of sin because they believe not on me; of righteousness, because I go to my Father, and ye see me no more; of judgement, because the prince of this world is judged," John 16:7-11. These verses give us the important part the Holy Ghost has in the plan of our salvation. He is the One who reproves, or convicts, a person of sin. When we hear our conscience telling us we need to repent for anything it is the Holy Ghost who has revealed that light to us. After repentance and acceptance of the blood of Jesus to blot out our sins we still often have a guilty feeling over some of our habits, our shortcomings, quick tempers and failures. It is the Holy Ghost who convicts us and calls us to draw closer to Jesus who paved the way and paid the price for a total commitment to Him. "Howbeit when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth: for He shall not speak of Himself: but whatsoever He shall hear, that shall He speak: and He will show you things to come," John 16:13. One of the jobs of the Holy Ghost is to teach us or to open our understanding that we might be better equipped to deal with the temptations of this life; also to guide us into the paths of righteousness that our joys in a Christian walk might be full.

One day while John the Baptist was baptizing in the Jordan River, he saw Jesus coming and said, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world. This is He of whom I said, 'After me cometh a man which is preferred before me: for He was before me. And I knew Him not: but that He should be made manifest to Israel. therefore I am come baptizing with water.' And John bare record, saying, 'I saw the Spirit decending from heaven like a dove, and it abode upon Him. And I knew Him not: but He that sent me to baptize in water, the same said unto me, Upon whom thou shalt see the Spirit decending, and remaining on Him, the same is He which baptizeth with the Holy Ghost,' "John 1:29-33. By these scriptures we learn that Jesus paid the price for our salvation but that salvation is not completed in us until we have also received the baptism of the Holy Ghost.

But wait—Jesus came to be the Lamb of God, and was the sacrifice for our sins; "That whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life," John 3:16. To accept Christ as our Savior makes it possible to have eternal life because He blots out the sins we have committed. Then in John 17:17-19 we read, "Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth. —And for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth." After

we have had our sins blotted out the next step in God's plan of salvation is sanctification. To be sanctified does not make it impossible to sin again but it does take away the desire for the things of sin. We are better fitted to overcome sin. In sanctification we let the blood of Christ not only blot out the sins we have committed but we let it cleanse our temples (bodies). Old habits such as filthy conversation, vile language, smoking, drinking, and telling lies—yes, even gossip can no longer be a part of our lives if we are sanctified. These things are habits which cannot be controlled without having the inbread nature to sin cleansed.

After we have been thoroughly cleansed through sanctification we are then candidates for the baptism of the Holy Ghost. The latter part of John 14:17 says the Holy Ghost dwells with us but shall be in us. John the Baptist said Jesus would baptize us with the Holy Ghost. We read in 1 Corinthians 6:15-18 that we are members of the body of Christ and as such, we cannot partake of the sins so prevalent among people who claim to be christians but do not live the life necessary to be a testimony of that claim. Then in verses 19 and 20 of the same chapter we read "What? know ye not that our body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's."

The Holy Ghost will not come into a temple which is unclean and burdened down with sin and sinful habits. Today there are a number of cults and even organized churches who endorse a counterfeit of the Baptism of the Holy Ghost. I recently read an article written by a man who had attended a convention of a Charismatic movement with people of various denominations who claimed the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, yet the room was filled with cigarette smoke! Such is not the Baptism of the Holy Ghost but people who do such only make a mockery of the real experience.

Joel prophesied of the Baptism of the Holy Ghost in chapter 2:28, 29, "And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions: and also upon the servants and upon the handmaids in those days will I pour out my Spirit."

Jesus said, "And, behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high," Luke 24:49. "And being assembled together with them, commanded them that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father, which', saith He, 'ye have heard of Me. For John truly baptized with water; but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost not many days hence," Acts 1:4,5. Then in verse 8 of the same chapter Jesus also says, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." Both in Luke and in these verses from Acts is peaks of receiving power through the baptism of the Holy Ghost. That power is a confidence to let Him work through you in witnessing of the saving grace of the Lord Jesus Christ; a boldness to stand true in the face to temptation or persecution; the grace to be submissive to His will in all things without reservations; and the power to be an overcomer and victorious at all times.

On the day of Pentecost—that word does not denote an experience as some use it but merely means a Jewish feast which occurred 50 days after the Passover." And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance," Acts 2:1-4. The next several verses say people from many nations heard them speaking in their own languages. Then the same Peter who had feared the multitudes and denied the Christ, stood up and preached a sermon which resulted in about 3,000 souls accepting Christ as their Savior. Peter declared this speaking in tongues to be that of which Joel had prophesied. In Acts 2:39 Peter also said, "For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call." When we put it all together we understand the Baptism of the Holy Ghost is for us today and that it is to give us power to witness. The speaking in other languages is the evidence that we have been baptized. When one has had his sins forgiven through the blood of Christ; the saving power of His blood has done an inward work in the soul of man which is later witnessed through the act of water baptism. One must be completely immersed in the water to receive that baptism and so it is with the baptism of the Holy Ghost, we are completely immersed, even to the use of our tongues, to do His will. The tongue is the one member of the body which man cannot tame, James 3:2-8, but when the Holy Ghost baptizes us, He takes control of the tongue and we let Him tame it to speak only those things which praise and edify.

Let it also be understood though, that this baptism is given in definite clear languages. It is not a "jibberish jabber." When the Holy Spirit fell upon those in the upper room on the day of Pentecost He gave them definite languages that were understood by other people who spoke those languages. When the Holy Spirit fell during the Bible School in Topeka, Kansas on New Years day 1901 there were in the course of a few days several people who heard them speak and were able to identify the language spoken. One Hebrew man heard the Bible read in his own language and asked for the Bible. When they gave it to him he said that was not the one. He wanted the Hebrew Bible because that was what they had read. Even reporters from different well known news papers heard them speak and published what they heard. Though the language spoken is unknown to the speaker, if it is given by the Holy Ghost, it will be a definite language.

It is given for a sign and is the evidence of the inward work we have received from the Holy Ghost. If an unknown language is spoken in a public assembly, the Bible says it must also be interpreted; and the interpretation is also given by the Holy Ghost.

Let us look a bit farther into the history of what happened since the outpouring of the Holy Ghost at the Bible School conducted by Charles F. Parham in 1901. Brother Parham, assisted by different students held services in a number of places for the next few years. Then in 1906 he held another Bible School in Houston, Texas. Many received the Baptism of the Holy Ghost during the school term. One of the

students from this school felt led to carry the message to California. Though this student did not have the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, he preaced it and several received it. From this work the Azuza Street Mission in Los Angeles was started. Soon afterward a fanatical spirit came into the work there and they sent for Brother Parham but as a result of the unteachable spirit, he was asked to leave soon after arriving. Through this fanatical group were started several movements believing in fleshly manifestations. Such flesh manifestations as falling under the power and dancing in the spirit do not come from the power of the Holy Ghost. His power gives us a quiet peace that we are not troubled with the powers of this world because "Greater is He that is in you, than he that is in the world," 1 John 4:4. Satan can, and does, counterfeit any part of God's plan of salvation except sanctification. The only way to receive the true Baptism of the Holy Ghost is to first be sanctified and completely cleansed so the Holy Ghost can enter into a clean temple. If we first honor the blood of Christ to do this cleansing then invite the Holy Ghost to come in. He will give us a blessed experience which is free from fleshly manifestations and jabbering tongues. There is a real product for every counterfeit. This goes as much for the Baptism of the Holy Ghost as for anything else. We do not stop preaching the forgiveness of sins just because there are hypocrites in the church, neither should we let the counterfeit of the Baptism of the Holy Ghost keep us from seeking God for the real experience that would give us the power and boldness to speak for our Lord.

Even though the powers of satan have caused great confusion and even distaste for a closer walk with our Lord, it is still real today and He has it for anyone who will seek Him with an honest heart for that which will make them pure in His sight.

THE GREAT DEEP

When you read your bible, do you ever start at the very beginning? If so, do you have any idea of what it's talking about? Let's see if you do.

In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. And the earth was without form and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

Now as I see it without form and void suggests that there was no form of life of any kind either plant or animal. And darkness was upon the face of the deep. What was the deep? And the spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. Do you think it was the ocean that it's talking about? Well let's just see how wrong you are, if that's what you think and I suspect that most people do, if they have as much as given it a thought, because in my lifetime, I've never talked to anyone who did know what it was.

I believe if we study our bible carefully and reverently, seeking to learn what it really teaches, without trying to make it say what some Theologian's doctrine says it does, that the Holy Spirit will show us many things that will simply amaze us.

Now let's go on down to the sixth verse. And God said let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters and let it divide the waters from the waters. And God made the firmament and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament and it was so. Well now just what was this firmament? Well the eighth verse says God called the firmament heaven. Well if we study this very carefully we find that it isn't speaking of the place where God's Throne is but the sky which is often referred to as the heavens. Now the ninth verse says, and God said, let the waters under the heaven be gathered together unto one place, and let the dry land appear, and it was so. Tenth verse says and God called the dry land earth; and the gathering together of the waters He called seas. Now here was the earth composed of continents and oceans or land and seas. Above it was this huge body of water up there above the heavens in space completely surrounding the earth spinning around the earth just as the satellites do in our time. Now if the earth was completely surrounded by this body of water known as the great deep, spinning around up there in space, with the sun shining down on this water, that would cause the whole earth to be one huge hot house. Well let's see if it was. Now in the third chapter of Genesis and tenth verse and eleventh verse we find that Adam and Eve were naked. Now I'm convinced that if they had been cold they would of wrapped something around them to protect and keep them warm if for no other reason. We also hear about mammoth elephants whose bodies have been found up near the north pole completely preserved as though they were quick frozen while they were grazing. Well we know that elephants are native to a hot climate. If the whole earth was a hot house that would account for them being up toward the north pole, but what would account for them being quick frozen.

Well we'll have to read a little farther to find the answer to that one. Now turn to the seventh chapter of Genesis and the eleventh verse, and we read, In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month the seventeenth day of the month the same day were all the fountains of the great deep broken up and the windows of heaven were opened.

And the rain was upon the earth forty days and forty nights. So you see when God was ready to bring the flood upon the earth all He did was cause this huge body of water to slow up in its spinning around the earth and allow the earth's gravity to pull it down. I suppose in order to protect Noah and the land also God caused it to slow gradually taking forty days and nights to completely come down. And the windows of heaven were opened and the sun shone upon the earth directly for the first time. If you will study the scriptures mentioned here I think it's just as clear as can be what the Great Deep was.

Isn't it interesting? There are many other things just as interesting if we will only study them with an unbiased view and just let the Holy Spirit reveal them to us.

This song will always mean alot to me as Vi called me the next morning after the doctor had a talk with her and her husband, Gerald, about the open heart surgery, singing this song. I tell you it was so pretty and sweet and you felt the definite positive feeling as she sang. O I tell you the Lord is good. Doctor said there was absolutely no chance to survive without the surgery and her odds were the worst they could be for this type of surgery. If you ask me a pretty black picture in the natural but Thanks be to God it takes just "One Touch of the Masters Hand."

On October 13, 1977 she had a massive heart attack-myocardial infarction, three cardiac arrests, the fourth cardiac arrest at their home on December 5, 1977. Doctor told the family he had done everything that was possible to do for her, - now it was left up to someone bigger than him. Well Praise the Lord a miracle was performed. The good Lord is the same yesterday, today and forever and the days of miracles are not over. Doctor said one in five hundred live after having the type of heart attack she had. During this past year she has witnessed to many hundreds of people and believe me the devil has fought her continually. Also about three or four weeks before her last trip to the hospital on October 31, 1978 she had three different speaking engagements at the hospital for the three different shifts on her out of body experience and on death and dying. The Lord really has blessed her at all her speaking engagements. The first part of this year the article of her healing miracle and out of body experience with her picture was in our paper. I know many of you read this and was blessed. So you see why this miracle of her coming through the open heart surgery is all over the hospital. I have been to Oklahoma, and several other speaking engagements with her. She tells of her salvation, healing miracle and her out of body experience and she has always said she was not afraid to die. Those days before she went in for surgery she practiced what she preached—she was face to face with death-and she was never afraid-Oh how beautiful it was.

One year, one month and three days later on November 16, 1978 she had a 6½ hour open heart surgery and has four by-passes. Gerald was told by the surgical nurse that as she was warming Vi's heart after surgery it started on its own accord. Very few start on their own accord, they have to be shocked back to beating. Doctors were amazed. And also said she was starting to heal before she left the surgery room. Isn't that just like Jesus.

The surgeon came in the room where Gerald and all the family members, myself and two of Vi's good friends were and told him about the surgery, and said everything went beautiful. Tears of joy was shed and Thanksgiving was given the Lord for His protecting hand over Vi. I know the Lord has some more work for her to do for Him. And believe me she is so thankful to the Lord—right now in the hospital she is witnessing for Him. I wish everyone could hear her give her sermonette—it is really good and the presence of the Lord has been in everyone to bless people, there are no dry eyes in the congregation.

The Lord has given her such sweet peace, assurance, courage—in fact she encouraged many people who cried and was so upset because she had to have this surgery. The Lord gave me assurance that she was going to make it through the surgery also and money cannot buy that. As you walk into her hospital room the presence of the Lord is felt so sweet. Her Doctor said he has never seen such courage and confidence in any of his patients in a long, long time as he seen in Vi. And as the days went by and it got closer to the day, his confidence was built up each day as he visited her and by the day she went in for surgery, he was confident too she was going to make it. When Jesus takes over and works in a persons life like He has Vi's it is the most wonderful, outstanding sweet experience. The surgeon let the family in to see her an hour after surgery, two at a time. She was awake and knew each one of us but could not talk.

Several of the nurses have told me she is doing things and mending quicker than open heart surgery patients ordinarily do. The Lord does make a difference between them that serve Him and those that don't.

Another touching thing about Vi's surgeon is that the morning of surgery, he told her God was going to guide his hands as he operated. Thank the Lord for surgeons like this.

Vi and I met eleven years ago this coming January 6, 1979 at 3:30 p.m. I was in St. Joseph Hospital also. six months after my sweet dear mother passed away, I landed in the hospital. I was at my lowest ebb spiritually, mentally, physically and financially-did not want to live. Those six months were horrible. But the good Lord is mindful of us through the good and bad of our life. Vi was the nurse that took care of me at this time. She was definitely my "God Send." As she came into my hospital room she was not walking on the floor but was about 12 inches off the floor and there was the most beautiful glow she was engulfed in. Her smile and tender look in her eyes I will never forget. She was an angel of the Lord He sent to me. As she came to my bed and touched me on the shoulder-there was such warmth you just can't explain it. She did not know any of this until I was out of the hospital and I called her one day. I know the Lord caused our paths to cross.

To me Vi is and always will be very, very, very, special. She has helped me in so many ways. What an inspiration she is to me. She is just one in a million.

Read Psa. 91—Psa. 23—Psa. 37:3,4,5,6, and first part of verse 7 says "Rest IN The LORD"—This is very important for us all to do each day of our lives. "Only one life t'will soon be past, only whats done for Christ will last."

I am very thankful to the Lord—He is a good God. He sticketh closer than a brother and is a present help in everytime of need. His grace is sufficient and He said He will never leave us nor forsake us but go with us all the way even to the end of the world.

I know He is coming soon and I want to hear Him say "Well done thou good and faithful servant." I like the saying I saw on one of the City employees desk—"Don't give up on me—God is not through with me yet." I want to be clay in the potters hand, so He can mold me and make me what He wants me to be.

May God Bless you each and everyone is my prayer. Thank you again. We all are brothers and sisters in Christ. Continue to pray for Vi through her convalencing days and her adjusting time.


