BE PART OF THE TRUE VINE

Acts 9: 26-31; Psalm 22:26-32; 1 John 3:18-24; John 15:1-8

"Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." Last Sunday we celebrated Good Shepherd Sunday, when we were reminded of our responsibility to follow in the footsteps of Christ, the Good and Eternal Shepherd. We were challenged to live lives worthy of our call as Christians - a life of selfless sacrifice and mutual love – dying to self and living for others.

A story is told of Mahatma Gandhi. He is known as the "Father of Indian Independence." We all know him as the modern creator and leader of passive and non-violent resistance and social protest. He was born in India, and was brought up a Hindu. He later migrated to South Africa where he studied law. As a student in the apartheid South Africa, Gandhi was faced with prejudice and discrimination against people of color. He later began to read the gospels and was very much interested in learning about Jesus Christ. One Sunday morning when Gandhi attempted to attend a church service, he was stopped at the entrance of the church, and told that people of color were not welcomed at the church. Due to that unfortunate incident, Gandhi never set foot in a Christian church to learn about Jesus. When asked about his experience, Gandhi is quoted as saying, "You Christians really have someone in Jesus Christ, but you do not know it; and you do not use His power that is available to you." He went on to say, "I truly love your Christ, but I hate you, Christians, because you do not follow the teachings of Christ."

Today's first reading tells us of a similar experience Saul (later named Paul) had. Saul was an ardent persecutor and murderer of Christ's followers. He finally encountered Christ while he was on his way to Damascus to murder Christians. He was converted to the Way, and later became an ardent supporter and preacher of the good news. Because of his past life, some Christians were suspicious of him, thus, they did not want to have anything to do with him. Someone had to vouch for him before the community of believers would accept him into their fold. It was not until Barnabas stepped forward to speak on his behalf that Saul (Paul) was given a chance at acceptance as one of their own. This incident highlights the fact that in order to have a genuine relationship with God we must have good relationships with others - our mothers, fathers, children and members of the Christian community. As a Christian, one should not try to go it alone – we need the love and the support of others in the community. You and I need the congregation and the congregation needs us. That is why in today's gospel Jesus says: "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). We can only bear lasting fruit if we are able to bond together.

Left alone, you and I can do nothing. We need to be a part of the Vine, Jesus Christ, Who manifests Himself in His Church. In fact, left alone we will not be able to bear fruit. When you and I discriminate against each other and act as though we are islands, we lose our Christian identity, which challenges us to see each person as a creature of God – a brother and a sister, branches of the One and True Vine, Jesus Christ. In fact, if you and I are faithful to the unity that exists in Christ, "ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you."

Let us pray for our children who are confirmed this Sunday, that sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, they may become active members of the Vine, Jesus Christ, and thus may bear fruits in the witness they give in the Christian community.


