"HUNGRY LIONS AND PRESSING DEADLINES"

One of the things we know about the Old Testament prophet Daniel is that he was a man of prayer. The bible tells us that "three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed" (Daniel 6:10). We also know that when he was ordered not to pray by a king who could've executed him for disobedience, he decided to pray about it (Daniel 6:6-10). As a result, his conduct was reported to the king and he was thrown into a den of lions. Of course we know that in the end God delivered Daniel from the lions. But it's interesting to notice how undeterred Daniel was in his original commitment to prayer.

When we compare Daniels prayer life with our own, we have to admit that we often surrender our privileged conversations with God to much less demanding circumstances. Even the smallest hindrances can cause us to set aside or reschedule our quiet times with God.

WHEN WE WORK TOGETHER, WE MAXIMIZE OUR IMPACT

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 says, "Two people are better than one, because they get more done by working together. If one falls down, the other can help him up. But it is bad for the person who is alone and falls, because no one is there to help. If two lie down together, they will be warm, but a person alone will not be warm. An enemy might defeat one person, but two people together can defend themselves; a rope that is woven of three strings is hard to break" (NCV).

This passage has a lot to say about serving with others in ministry, but it can be summarized in three statements:

1. When we work together, we maximize our impact.

We get more done. Do you want to make a global impact with your life? Then do it with other people in your church, because what we do together as the Body of Christ will be far more significant than what we do individually. One drop of rain doesn't make a big difference on a desert, but a million drops of rain can turn that desert into a garden.

2. When we work together, we minimize our failure.

As Verse 10 asks, when you're serving on your own and you fall down, who's going to pick you up? When we serve together and one person falls down,

the other people just pick him up. Doesn't that make a simple but profound point? We need to work with other people to encourage each other and minimize our failures.

3. When we work together, we mobilize our resources.

When we pool our resources and funds, they go further. You can share the blanket, and two people will stay warm instead of one.

In Matthew 25:40, Jesus taught, 'I tell you the truth, anything you did for even the least of my people here, you also did for me" (NCV).

- Income Documentation (W2's, 1099's, Unemployment, Social Security, Alimony or Maintenance, Interest, Sales of Stocks, Cash Income, Scholarships, etc.)
- Documentation for Deductions and Expenses (property Taxes, Home Mortgage Interest, Medical Expenses, Charitable Contributions, Unreimbursed Employee Business Expense, Student Loan Interest, Alimony Paid, Unreimbursed Educators Expense, Self-Employment Expenses, etc.)

4 Ways to Teach Your kids Love This Valentine's Day

1. As parents before we can teach anything we must first do a bit of research.



What is it that the Bible tells us about God's love. (Look up these verses together: 1 John 4:8; 1 Corinthians 13:4-8; John 3:16; Mark 12:30-31; John 15:13; 1 John 3:16-18) As we are then discussing this with our children we need to not only enforce to them that God's love is a perfect love but that His love is a type of love that we should aspire to give others as well.

Speak of those real life examples of those who give real life examples.... Missionaries, Preachers, Sunday School teachers and parents are all good places to look for this selfless love.

2. Of course no good lesson is never complete until we show an example.

One of the greatest ways to show our children how to love is to show it to others ourselves. Allowing your children to see you serving and caring for others is a wonderful way to plant that seed of service in their hearts.

- Visit the elderly in your church
- Make a special trip to visit a widow for Valentine's Day
- Send out little valentines and instead of signing your name include a Bible verse.
- Use this day to reach those around you and to minister to your children's hearts. Trust me they are watching and taking notes.

3. Next up it is time to allow them to put to practice what they are learning.

Now this can be done in several day to day operations in your home. For example are your children struggling to get along....This would be a great time to pull our Bible verses to remind them how we are suppose to handle conflict with one another. Have your children tell you what it is that they are good at. Once they decide, figure out a way that they can use that gift to bless someone and then make it happen. Constantly seek out ways that your child can apply what they have learned about God's love and then help them to achieve it.

4. Finally remember to praise them for their efforts.

The world we live in is full of those who wish to quiet those who want to bask in God's love and quiet those who want to speak of God's love. Remind them often while they are little why this is all so important, share with them your own struggles and be your child's private cheerleader. This will create a bond in your future missionary that can never be broken.


