More of Respect Life Month

The 40 Days for life campaign as of this writing is credited for saving 163 lives from abortion. That is a great statistic so let us pray that even more lives will be saved by the end of this campaign on November 3.

Another topic that comes under the respect life theme is euthanasia. You may know it from the medical term- physician assisted suicide. In today's society euthanasia is often thought of as compassionate act for someone that is suffering terrible pain from a disease that will eventually kill them anyway. But most people don't realize that the word compassion means 'to suffer with.' Hospice care is certainly a good ministry to substitute for 'assisted suicide.' Hospice care keeps the person comfortable with medical staff and medications that respect the natural end of a person's life.

You may recall the name Jack Kevorkian from news stories from the 90's. He was known as Dr. Death because he assisted people in ending their lives. There was a debate about whether what he was doing was good or bad. He was tried four times between 1994 and 1997 in the court system. He was acquitted three times and the fourth trial ended in a mistrial. He was eventually found guilty of second-degree homicide in 1999 and served 8 years in jail. Kevorkian eventually died himself in 2011 at the age of 83.

He always seemed to me as someone who liked the publicity and was not compassionate but opportunistic. A man who liked to play God every chance he could get. True compassion is 'suffering with' someone. It's talking to them, holding their hand, and listening to them. Being with him or her over several days or months, or years- not delivering poison into their bodies. Hospice care is a way to die with dignity and let God determine when someone is to die.

Every day we can spend with our loved ones is a gift and those people's lives that are ended prematurely through physician assisted suicide may deny their loved ones the opportunity to have a special day when something wonderful happens to bring them true peace.

Sadly, our culture has grown worse in respecting life from the womb to the tomb over the past few years. St. John Paul II referred to it as a 'Culture of Death.' Oregon was the first state to legalize physician assisted suicide on October 27, 1997. Since then Washington D.C. and the following states have also legalized it: California, Colorado, Vermont and Maine (starting on January 1, 2020).

The basis of the Hippocratic Oath is 'first do no harm.' Killing your patient is the worst form of harm that you can give! Let us pray that euthanasia will not be legalized in other states and that the medical community will go back to the 'old days' and do their best to preserve the lives of all their patients!
