

It Ain't Over Yet!

Well, you can tell that Easter is behind us because you see all those Easter Baskets, plastic Easter Eggs, jelly beans and various other egg-shaped chocolates have made their way to the clearance isles of the store. This is sad, because I really love Easter and the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I love the feeling of the church service on Easter morning and seeing the church filled with worship. I wish it lasted longer than just one day!

I have a little secret for you and this may surprise some of you...but Easter is not over, it has just begun.



According to the church calendar, Easter (like Christmas) is not just one day. Just as Christmas starts December 25th and last 12 days; Easter started March 27, 2016 and it lasts not 12 but 50 days. Although the date for the beginning of Easter changes every year, it lasts 50 days none the less. Western churches (Catholic and Protestant) celebrate Easter on the first Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox. This means that Easter may take place anywhere between March 22 and April 25.

Because Easter is the most important feast in the Christian calendar—even more important than Christmas—the Easter season continues on for 50 days, through the Ascension of Our Lord (May 8, 2016) to Pentecost Sunday(May 15, 2016). Indeed, for the purpose of fulfilling our Easter Duty, the Easter season extends until Trinity Sunday (May 22, 2016) the first Sunday after Pentecost!

Our ancestors found great symbolic meaning in these 50 days of Easter. For example, 50 days is seven weeks — a week of weeks plus one day. That extra day was the Eighth Day, the same name they gave to Sunday — the day of resurrection, the day that symbolized eternity. It's not just the start of a new seven-day week but the beginning of a whole new creation. Fifty days is also just about one-seventh of the whole year, so these 50 days hold the same relationship to the year as Sunday does to the week. That's why the 50 days of Easter are known as the Great Sunday of the entire year.




While 50 days of unmitigated joy seems hard for us to sustain today, the season still has meaning. It's the time when we are meant to experience what it means when we say Christ is risen. It's the season when we hear and ponder the beginnings of our Church, the gifts of the Spirit, and the meaning and mission of discipleship.

So keep on celebrating and wishing your friends a happy Easter!





Food Pantry Assistant Position Opening

BMUMC is seeking help from an individual in overseeing our Daily Bread Food Pantry operations. This is a paid part-time position (\$10.00/hour; approximately 50 hours/month) and the person who fills it will work closely with the church's Administrative Assistant and the Food Pantry Volunteers to ensure that the operation runs smoothly and operates in an accountable manner.

Key responsibilities of this position include:

- Coordinate volunteer workers to ensure that the Food Pantry is staffed during all hours it is open and also during regular major food delivery times. The Food Pantry/Delivery schedule is as follows;
 - Monday and Wednesday; 9:00 am noon.
 - Tuesday and Thursday; 5:00 pm 7:00 pm.
 - Thursday; Food Delivery only 10:00 am noon.
- Work with volunteers to ensure that:
 - Measurable activities are logged onto the proper forms [volunteer daily work hours, client signin sheets, new client cards (with appropriate identification checked), daily shopping lists, receipts of food with weights and type of food noted].
 - Food received from Feeding South Florida, Publix, Winn Dixie, Star of the Sea (SOS) Farmshare, and other sources is sorted and stored properly.
 - Food Pantry shelves are continuously restocked.
 - Boxes are broken down and trash taken to the dumpster each day.
- Coordinate activities and reporting as required with God's Kitchen staff.

The person that fills this position should have good interpersonal skills, enabling them to work with a variety of groups and individuals, and be able to use a computer well enough to enter data tracking Food Pantry operations.

All applicants should apply by submitting a resume to the church office in person Monday through Thursday from 9:00 am – 4:00 pm, or by emailing bae_bmumc@att.net, or by sending a fax to 305-852-4917. The Staff Parish Relations Committee will conduct interviews and make the final selection. *The deadline for applications to be received by the church office is noon on April 20, 2016.* For additional information contact the church office at 305-852-2581.
