AT FEATHER LAKE

The latest dry streak at Feather Lake is now approaching 4 months. We still have a ways to go to surpass the 9.5-month dry streak in 2010-11. Or the 7-month dry streak in 2012-13. The adjacent Feather Lake II basin is also dry, as ground water levels in the area remain depressed.

Our next workday at Feather Lake takes place Sat., February 8 starting at 9 a.m. At the basin's inlet, we've removed most of the trash washed in by last September's storms. Now, we'll take on the interior.

Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.

Audubon at RIO BOSQUE WETLANDS PARK

Over 3,000 ducks are now present, but, as always at this time of year, it is unclear how much longer water will be delivered to the park. Last year, deliveries were cut off February 3. For up-to-date information on water conditions and the park's birds, check www.riobosque.org.

We will meet at 6:30 a.m. at the parking lot

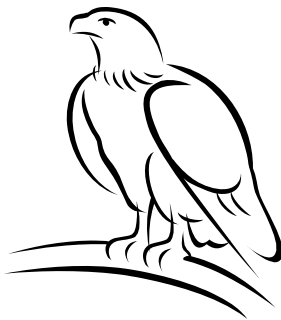
at the Burlington Coat Factory at 1144 N. Yarbrough. Exit at Yarbrough, at the light turn left under I-10. Burlington is on the right.

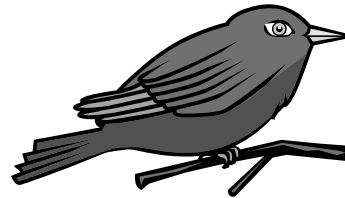

**Saturday, March 8, 2014
Rattlesnake Springs and,
time permitting, Frijole Ranch.**

Rattlesnake Springs, part of Carlsbad Caverns National Park, is an Important Bird Area (IBA) and outstanding stopover site for land birds. We'll be looking for wintering birds. There have been some unusual sightings recently, such as the Streak-backed Oriole . At Frijole Ranch, we could see Western Bluebirds, Western Scrub-Jay, Spotted Towhees and others.

Meet at 6:45 a.m. in front of the Evergreen Cemetery, 12400 E. Montana, ¼ mile east of Loop 375. Bring a lunch, water and binoculars.

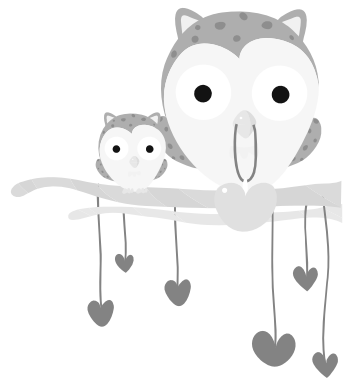
Seeking volunteers for Burrowing Owl Conservation Projects at the Rio Bosque Wetlands Park

Would you like to assist with any of the following projects?

Nest sites need a major makeover.
Many artificial nest boxes and burrows are packed with soil and unusable or have been destroyed by canids. Help is needed for the construction and reinstallation of modified and improved nest boxes and burrow systems. Project begins Oct. 17, 2013 and will continue until finished.

Research opportunities.
Seasonal use and site fidelity. Volunteers are needed to monitor nest sites and record the alpha-numeric identification band on the owl's right leg using a spotting scope or good binoculars. Project begins in December 2013 and will continue throughout the 2014 breeding season.

Burrowing owl diet and reproductive success.
Help is needed with the installation of solar-operated off-grid DVR video systems at 2 or 3 nest sites and to monitor the prey items taken to the nests from the DVR recordings every 3-4 weeks. Ideal level of identification would be to Genus species or Family but generalizations such as insect, spider, rodent, lizard, etc. would be acceptable. Project begins this Dec. or in Jan 2014 (after installation).
