

The new Book of the Month for July & August will be Habits for Holiness: Small Steps for Making Big

Spiritual Progress by Fr. Mark-Mary Ames, CFR. This short book, approx. 130 pages, is a powerhouse of good, practical spiritual insights (inspired by St. Francis and Franciscan Spiritually in a real way) written by a young Capuchin Franciscan priest who currently does a number of popular media outreach initiatives online in our modern world [YouTube and Podcasting to name a few]. A reminder that the Diocese of Harrisburg requires a two year sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. The Word of God Alive: Discussing the Readings w/your children

Have you ever played with a boat in a pool or the bathtub? Maybe you made waves and watched the boat rock. In today's Gospel, we hear about a boat the disciples were traveling in being tossed on the waves. They saw Jesus walking on the choppy waves. It was shocking to them to see Jesus using his powers this way. They thought they were seeing a ghost. They were very afraid. Jesus saw this and reassured them by telling them to have courage. Peter did just that. Peter left the boat and started walking on water, just as Jesus told him to do. Who gave Peter the power to walk on water?



Peter became frightened by the wind and he began to sink. He cried out to Jesus for help. Jesus caught him and said to take courage. Jesus wanted Peter to know that Jesus would always be there for him. Jesus had Peter's back.

God always listens to us when we ask. Sometimes people wonder if God listens to their prayers. **Have you ever felt like that?**

Because we can't see God, it's not easy to know God is active in our lives. Just like Jesus had Peter's back, God has our back. He is always with us, loving and caring for us. We have to trust that God wants only what is good for us.

Living our Faith: Take some time this week to pray and listen to God so that your faith will grow.
