* Open to any youth 18 & under – youth must be able to walk the animal in the ring and control the head of the sheep without assistance.

Show Order: Southdown, Dorper, White Dorper, AOB

General Show Rules

- 1. Entries can be completed online (www.chisholmtraildorpers.com), or you can enter the day of the event.
- 2. **Out of state exhibitors**: All Out of state sheep must be accompanied by a must be accompanied by a current (within 30 days) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that meets all state requirements, issued by a certified veterinarian. **Additionally:** Breeding rams 6 months of age or older from **out-of-state** must have a negative **Brucella Ovis ELISA test** within 30 days prior to being entered in a show, fair or exhibition, or they must come from a Brucella Ovis-free flock. The test results or herd number must be written on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- 3. Heelers assistance will be allowed in the 2-tooth & aged divisions only.
- 4. Animals showing signs of ringworm, fungus or other communicable diseases will not be allowed to show and must be removed from show grounds.
- 5. Age Sheep will be shown based on teeth development.
 - Ram Lamb Division All sires must be carrying all milk teeth at the time of Check-In and Show. Sires which show either or both of their first pair of permanent incisors will not be eligible to be shown in the ram lamb division.
 - 2-Tooth Division All sires must show one or both teeth of first pair of permanent incisors. Sires which show one or both teeth of the first pair of permanent incisors are eligible to show only in the 2-Tooth division.
 - Aged Division All sires must show more than the first pair of permanent incisors. Sires which show more than first pair of permanent incisors are eligible to show only in the Aged class.
- 6. Show Weight: Official show weights. Exhibitors will turn in card for official show weight for their rams at the scales. Scales open at 10:00am and close at 12:00pm Saturday 10/29/22. Weight changes will not be allowed at any time. There will be no weigh backs.
- 7. Limited number of horse stalls available.

CLASSIFICATION TERMS:

Acceptable: Characteristics that represent the breed.

Discriminatory: Characteristics that are not reason for absolute disqualification but in combination with other discriminatory visual characteristics could lead to removal from a breed division.

Absolute Disqualifications: Unfavorable visual characteristics resulting in removal from a breed division.

Scur: Horn growth that is not completely attached to the skull.

Birthmark: Dark pigmented skin with dark fiber present within the margins of the pigmentation.

SOUTHDOWN

Acceptable

- Hair color on muzzle should be mouse-colored, gray to brown and match color on legs and pasterns.
- Nostril pigmentation may be black to purplish-gray.
- Head and muzzle should be broad and proportional to body.
- Head of moderate length and in proportion to body.
- Ears of moderate length, in proportion to body, and covered with short hair or wool.
- Black hooves.
- Slight chalk around eyes.
- Slight chalk around muzzle.
- Spots or speckles in the skin only when shorn.

Discriminatory

- Solid white color or dark chocolate color on muzzle.
- Coarse britch and/or harsh pelt.
- Predominately pink nose with few black spots.
- Long, narrow muzzle.
- Excessive black pigmentation on ears.
- Excessive ear length not in proportion to head.
- No hair or wool on ears.
- Scurs.
- Absence of wool between scur areas.
- Striped hooves.
- Reddish, rust colored hair above hoof to pastern.
- Black fibers in wool outside of birthmark.
- Birthmarks.

Absolute Disqualification

- Speckled face, ears, or legs.
- Horns.
- White hooves.
- Intentional alteration of hair color or skin pigmentation.
- Total pink pigmentation of nostrils.
- Black lambs.
- Surgical alterations other than re-docking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge.

Acceptable

- Must be a White Dorper.
- Conformation: long, deep, wide body with well sprung ribs and excellent muscling.
- Color: White Dorper white sheep with black coloring less than the size of a nickle, and brown or red coloring less than the size of your hand
- Must have at least 1/3 hair primarily on belly and forearm.
- 100% hair below the knees and hocks.
- 100% hair forward of poll.
- Moderate size ear with no wool covering.
- Head should be strong, bold with a deep jaw.
- Polled or small horns or scurs.
- Spots or speckled pigment in the skin only when shorn.

Discriminatory

- Tall, leggy, shallow, and/or narrow-bodied lambs.
- A white sheep with brown or red colored speckles in the covering, confined to the head
- and neck.
- Tri-colored sheep
- Excessive wool covering more than 2/3 of body (belly, forearm).
- Wool forward of poll.
- Heavy horns.
- Long, pendulous ears.
- Long, narrow muzzle.

Absolute Disqualification

- All wool or very little evidence of hair on belly and forearm.
- Wool below the knees or hocks.
- Wool on the ears.
- Excessive amount of dark fibered spots on body and underline behind heart girth exceeding a cumulative total of the size of a softball.
- Solid brown, red, rust colored head.
- Speckling or spots from knee to dewclaw or from hock to dewclaw.
- Strong breed characteristics of breeds other than Dorper or White Dorper.
- Surgical alterations other than re-docking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.
- Evidence of color alterations.
- If the animal is not classified as a white dorper due to coloring they will be moved to the Dorper class, however if the animal is not classified as either a white dorper or dorper they will be moved to the medium wool class.

Acceptable

- Must be a Dorper.
- Conformation: long, deep, wide body with well sprung ribs and excellent muscling.
- Color: Dorper white sheep with black limited to head, neck, and forequarters not below the knee or behind the heart girth.
- Must have at least 1/3 hair primarily on belly and forearm.
- 100% hair below the knees and hocks.
- 100% hair forward of poll.
- Moderate size ear with no wool covering.
- Head should be strong, bold with a deep jaw.
- Polled or small horns or scurs.
- Spots or speckled pigment in the skin only when shorn.
- Black spots above the hoof line and below the dewclaw.

Discriminatory

- Tall, leggy, shallow, and/or narrow-bodied lambs.
- A limited amount of dark fibered spots on body and underline behind heart girth not to exceed a cumulative total of the size of a softball.
- Tri-colored sheep
- Excessive wool covering more than 2/3 of body (belly, forearm).
- Wool forward of poll.
- Heavy horns.
- Long, pendulous ears.
- Long, narrow muzzle.

Absolute Disqualification

- All wool or very little evidence of hair on belly and forearm.
- Wool below the knees or hocks.
- Wool on the ears.
- Excessive amount of dark fibered spots on body and underline behind heart girth exceeding a cumulative total of the size of a softball.
- Solid brown, red, rust colored head.
- Speckling or spots from knee to dewclaw or from hock to dewclaw.
- Strong breed characteristics of breeds other than Dorper or White Dorper.
- Surgical alterations other than re-docking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.
- Evidence of color alterations.
- If the animal is not classified as a dorper they will be moved to the AOB class.

AOB

This class will be any wether sire that does not fit into the Southdown, Dorper or White Dorper class.

Wether Doe Rules

General Show Rules

- 1. Entries can be completed online (www.chisholmtraildorpers.com), or enter the day of the event.
- 2. **Out of state exhibitors**: All out-of-state goats must be accompanied by a current (within 30 days) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that meets all state requirements, issued by a certified veterinarian.
- 3. Heelers assistance will be allowed in the 2-tooth & aged divisions only. Any exhibitor under the age of 9 that needs assistance in the ram lamb division may have another youth exhibitor assistance.
- 4. Does can be fitted or slick shorn above the knee and hocks. Animals showing signs of ringworm, fungus or other communicable diseases will not be allowed to show and must be removed from show grounds.
- 5. Does showing signs of any pronounced defect or abnormality will be banned from showing at the discretion of show management. ie. Overbite or underbite.
- 6. Age Goats will be shown based on teeth development.
 - Doe Kid Division All does must be carrying all milk teeth at the time of Check-In and Show. Does which show either or both of their first pair of permanent incisors will not be eligible to be shown in the doe kid division.
 - Yearling Division All does must show one or both teeth of first pair of permanent incisors. Does which show one or both teeth of the first pair of permanent incisors are eligible to show only in the yearling division.
 - Aged Division All does must show more than the first pair of permanent incisors. Does which show more than
 first pair of permanent incisors are eligible to show only in the Aged class.
- 7. Show Weight: Official show weights. Exhibitors will turn in card for official show weight for their does at the scales. Scales open at 10:00am and close at 12:00pm Saturday 10/29/22. Weight changes will not be allowed at any time. There will be no weigh backs.
- 9. No pens will be available.
