First Reading: Ez 34:11-16

I will watch over my sheep and tend them.

The Lord God says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I shall bring them out of the countries where they are; I shall gather them together from foreign countries and bring them back to their own land. I shall pasture them on the mountains of Israel, in the ravines and in every inhabited place in the land. I shall feed them in good pasturage; the high mountains of Israel will be their grazing ground. There they will rest in good grazing ground; they will browse in rich pastures on the mountains of Israel. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest - it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them.

Second Reading: Romans 5:5-11

God has entrusted his love to us.

The love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us. We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die - but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance.'

Love, not with Words but with Deeds

Along the path of life we come across both selfish and unselfish people. Perhaps we are all a mixture of generosity and selfishness. But to the extent that we may be still partly selfish, self-centred and indulgent, we still have a way to go to be living the message of Jesus to 'love one another as I have loved you'! Such is the love embodied and lived by Jesus which is symbolised in our traditional images of the Sacred Suffering Heart of Jesus.

To love from the heart is to look beyond oneself - not to become preoccupied with one's own weaknesses but through them understand and empathise with others. Jesus gave his life for others, reaching out to all of humanity, responding to their deeper needs, healing, forgiving, including and empowering. In his person he was the human expression of God's Love.

As we observe this feast, let us pray that this love may be reflected in our own attitudes, through our sympathy towards an understanding of people who are hurting in our families, neighbourhoods and wider world. Let us be people who act from the heart.

On this day, as we come together to honour the gift of God's divine Love to all, let us give thanks for the courage and self-sacrifice of those who went before us: pastors, families, religious sisters, lay people, who in extremely difficult and frugal times welcomed and supported each other to establish Sacred Heart Parish and School. Today we celebrate the diverse gifts, experiences, talents, wisdom and richness of each other. May we strive to be a community grounded and built on Love that embraces the hurting and lost and that flows through our actions of service into the world.

Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus



'I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments.

My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment" (Jesus to St. Margaret Mary).

Sixteenth century Calvinism and seventeenth century Jansenism preached a distorted Christianity that substituted for God's love and sacrifice of His Son for all people the fearful idea that a whole section of humanity was inevitably damned.

The Church always countered this view with the infinite love of our Saviour who died on the cross for all people. The institution of the feast of the Sacred Heart was soon to contribute to the creation among the faithful of a powerful current of devotion which since then has grown steadily stronger. The institution of the feast was a result of the appearances of our Lord to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1675. The celebration of the feast was extended to the general calendar of the Church by Pius IX in 1856.
