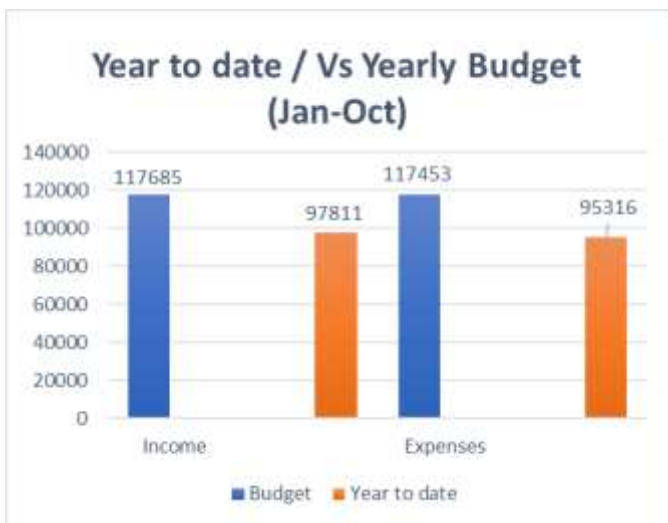
**Claiming Your Life As It is: Soul of Aging
