✚ Sunday Reflection: Friends, our Gospel Reading of today from St. John continues the Farewell Discourse of Jesus. In a special way this reading anticipates the coming feasts of Ascension and Pentecost. It tells both of Jesus' immanent departure and his promise of the Paraclete. Jesus knows what is going to happen. He knows what will happen to him, and more so what will happen to his disciples. But he not only knows what will happen, he is in charge of it. Because of this, he tells them, and us today, "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid," in other words, he is the Lord; he is in control; he is watching out for us... In Christ, we have someone we can count on – absolutely. Jesus also says to his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." Peace to the ancient Jews was God's greatest gift. It was much more than a temporary feeling of contentment, not simply the absence of violence. It is something much more positive, much deeper. Paradoxically, it can exist side by side with times of great turmoil. It is something internal, not external. Peace implied the fullness of prosperity and fruitfulness. It comes from an inner sense of security, of a conviction that God is with us and in us and that we are in the right place. It is something which not even the threat of death can take away. We pray for God's grace, that we may be filled with his peace and to always trust in his ever-lasting presence in all situations of our lives.
