Marine Corps History

Marines Help Put Down Prison Riot

On May 2, 1946, Marines from the Treasure Island Marine Barracks aided in suppressing a three-day prison riot at Alcatraz Federal Penitentiary in San Francisco Bay. The Marines were under the command of Warrant Officer Charles L. Buckner, a veteran of the Bougainville and Guam campaigns in World War II, and did not suffer a single casualty.

Marines Help Evacuate New Orleans Flood Victims

On May 8, 1995, Marines from Marine Forces Reserve demonstrated the Corps' quick-response capabilities in helping evacuate more than 2,500 civilians from the New Orleans area after one of the most devastating storm in more than 200 years hit the region.

Marines March toward Naha, Okinawa

On May 10, 1945, the 22nd Marines, 6th Marine Division, executed a pre-dawn attack across the Asa River Estuary and captured a bridgehead that allowed them to continue their attack toward Naha, the capital of Okinawa.

John Mackie Becomes First Marine to Earn Medal of Honor

On May 15, 1862, Corporal John F. Mackie became the first Marine to earn the Medal of Honor for his Service on the USS Galena during actions against Confederate shore batteries at Drewry's Bluff, near Richmond, Virginia.

Marine Aviation Program Begins

On May 22, 1912, First Lieutenant Alfred A. Cunningham became the first Marine officer to be assigned to "duty in connection with aviation" by Major General Commandant William P. Biddle after reporting for aviation training at the Naval Aviation Camp at Annapolis, Maryland. This marked the official beginning of the Marine aviation program.

Seeking strategies for ways to end Veteran suicide crisis

A major public health concern that affects everyone, suicide takes the lives of an estimated 45,000 Americans, including 6,000 Veterans, who die each year.

To combat Veteran suicide, President Donald J. Trump recently signed an executive order (EO) titled "National Roadmap to Empower Veterans and End Suicide" (PREVENTS), directing the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and the director of the White House Domestic Policy Council to co-chair and create an interagency

task force to develop a plan implementing a roadmap for the prevention of Veteran suicide at the national and community level.

As a result, the task force is releasing a Request for Information (RFI) to gather feedback on how to improve research and the use of research to radically reduce Veteran suicide. Through this RFI, and to ensure the broadest stakeholder input in the development of the national research strategy, VA is seeking input on ways to increase knowledge about factors influencing suicidal behaviors and ways to prevent suicide; inform the development of a robust and forward-looking research agenda; coordinate relevant research efforts across the Nation; and measure progress on these efforts. The public input provided in response to this RFI will inform the Veteran wellness, empowerment and suicide prevention task force, who will develop and implement the national research strategy.

All public comments regarding the RFI are welcome and should be submitted by August 5, 2019 to ensure they are considered in the national research strategy. Responses may be submitted online at https://www.research.va.gov/PREVENTS/.

Excerpt from Changed By War By Den Slattery

I was crouching at the corner of a house waiting for the enemy to come into clear view so I could blow them away. I had two pistols in my hands, and I was breathing hard from running.

Just then I noticed two soldiers walking toward me and I knew it was time for me to make my move. I waited in silence for them to get closer. It was obvious that they had no idea I was so near.

When they were about 25 feet away I came out of hiding with my guns blazing. They were both dead before they could even point their weapons in my direction. But what I hadn't noticed was a third soldier hiding behind a tree and pointing his rifle right at me. He pulled the trigger and I went flying backwards into the bushes. A few minutes later, my friends found me.

Just then I heard a familiar voice yelling-"Denny, It's time for dinner." My Mom wanted me home. I apologized to my friends, gathered my weapons, and ran home.

When I was growing up we loved to pretend we were really in the Army willing to risk our lives to help people. It was a game we played frequently.

Someday, I told myself, I will be in the military so I can take out bad guys and rescue people.

At the time, I had no idea just how prophetic those words were and that helping people wouldn't be just a game, but it would define my life.
