#### Congregational Council Minutes via Zoom September 12, 2021

ATTENDANCE: All were present except Joe Koon and one unfilled position

**CARES AND CONCERNS:** Praying for Allison Swygert's daughter-in-law's mom with dementia admitted to hospice house, and Cyndi Thurman recovering at home

**ADOPTION OF AGENDA:** Approved with no additions **ADOPTION OF MINUTES:** Approved with corrections **REPORTS:** 

- Pastor Gina: Written report received. Homecoming will be October 10<sup>th</sup>.
- Treasurer: Written report received for August 2021.
- Financial Secretary: Written report received for August 2021.
- Executive Committee: They recommend that council vote to "continue to take advantage of a ministry opportunity" in the parsonage. The tenant would be a pastor at a local church and his wife with no children. He anticipates being in the parsonage for 12-18 months beginning October 1st. The monthly facilities use for this tenant will be \$800. The tenant will be responsible for reimbursing the church for the actual amount of the electricity and water. The only maintenance needed for the parsonage is to clean the carpets at an estimated cost of \$250. **APPROVED by 11-1 vote.**

#### Team Reports/Recommendations:

Finance Committee: They recommend that if a motion is to be presented to council involving money, the motion must first be presented to the Finance Committee to determine where the funds will come from. **APPROVED** They recommend purchasing offering envelopes for 2022 to be direct mailed to members quarterly for a cost of \$340. The line "I communed today" would be removed from envelopes. This would save the church \$300 for 2022. **APPROVED** They recommend that the Office Administrator be paid additional hours as needed, approved by Pastor Gina. These hours will be paid for in an additional check once monthly. The projected additional monies will be included in 2022 budget proposal. **APPROVED** 

Outreach: Written report received from August meeting. Fulmer Middle School sent a thank you note for the items received in the school supply drive. Adopt-A-Highway was successfully completed on August 21<sup>st</sup>. The Red Cross Blood Drive resulted in 29 units of blood donated. The Food Pantry is low on funding but still distributed 78 setups in August.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- 1. Building Renovation & Repair Task Force: They recommend moving forward with the noted priority items approved by council. The cost of the projects is not to exceed \$45,000 and to be paid for out of excess loan proceeds. **APPROVED**
- 2. Cemetery Committee: Previous request rescinded
- 3. Church activities during Covid: Motion to recommend but not require masks on church property **APPROVED.** Motion to recommend postpone Food Truck Event on October 1<sup>st</sup> **NOT APPROVED.** Motion to recommend chicken stew event be drive thru/pickup only **APPROVED.** Recommend postpone Sunday School until next council meeting on October 10<sup>th</sup> **APPROVED.**

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. Loan Refinance: The Finance Committee recommends accepting the refinancing offer from Security Federal. The existing loan balance of \$306,756.78 would be converted to 68 payments of \$4998.00 at a fixed interest rate of 3.25%. This refinance has no origination fees, no closing costs, no attorney fees, and no appraisal fees. The cost of the refinancing to Mt. Hermon would be \$650. Our current loan expires in December 2021 and has an interest rate of 3.99%. **APPROVED**
- 2. Council Vacancy: The death of Buddy Hydrick has left an open term with 1 year and 3 months remaining. Our church constitution specifies how a vacancy is to be filled in items C10.04.04, C12.03, and C12.03.01. The member who at the last annual congregational meeting had the highest number of votes not seated on council would be asked to fill the unexpired term. This individual is Sheila Eargle and she has agreed to join council for the remainder of Buddy's term.
