AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

New Amana Playground Planned

After years of hearing from colony moms and dads that a playground with a public picnic area alongside it would be a very welcome addition to the Amana Colonies, the Amana Colonies Convention and Visitors Bureau board is working with the Amana Society, the Amana Community Chest, the Amana Colonies Historic Sites Foundation, Amana Colonies Trails and the Amana Heritage Society to build a new park and playground in Amana.

The playground project was announced last month by Stacey Colledge, executive director of the ACCVB.

With the goal of raising \$291,000 for the playground equipment and its installation, fund raising is now underway. An account at Bankhaus in Amana has been established to receive donations and so has a Go Fund Me page. To donate, you may drop off your donations at the Bankhaus in Amana or visit gofundme.com and search for Amana Colonies Playground.

The short term goal is to get an application in to the State of Iowa's Rural Enrichment Grant program which has an August 30th deadline. At least \$10,000 is needed before August 30 as a match for the grant application of \$30,000. So donations are needed right now to help earn this grant award.

Designed by Themed Concepts of Hugo, Minnesota, a park/ playground design firm, the Amana Colonies Playground will be an attractive playground that blends into the village with a design that engages kids. The theme is a stone and wood barn and mill with a faux water wheel. The play barn and mill features platforms, a tube slide, six foot and seven foot slides; a mini-rock wall climber, a grape trellis climber along with produce basket stepping stones and tree-like swing set. In creating their design, they took the suggestions of local residents and Amana Heritage Society staff members, while they surveyed the site and studied photos of Amana

To see drawings and photo concepts and to read about the playground's features go to the Amana Colonies Playground Facebook page.

It's hoped that with additional donations an offthe-leash dog park can be added at one end of the park, an addition that will surely please dog lovers.

It's a very ambitious goal as Colledge said, but she hopes to open the park in mid summer 2024. That depends, of course, on fund raising.

Colledge explained that her board has heard from many residents over the years that a play-ground was needed, both for community residents and for families who visit. "It was something that has come up so often over the years, and we thought, now let's make it happen."

"The park and playground is a vital resource to make people feel a connection with their community. Public places to relax and interact build a stronger sense of community, which is vital for our younger generations that flock away from rural communities. . ." she said.

Colledge and the ACCVB is spearheading the project with assistance from the lowa County Community Development group which has provided help with grant writing. The Amana Historic Sites Foundation and Amana Colonies Trails have both been involved in planning for long term maintenance, while the Amana Heritage Society has assisted with the educational elements of the playground design.

The Amana Society has pledged to provide the land for the park and playground and has written letters of support for the project to potential grant agencies. The Amana Community Chest has assisted with initial seed money.

"Every donation, whatever the size \$5, \$50, \$500 will be needed," Colledge told us, adding, "It's very heartwarming to see how the community has embraced the playground project. I'm very encouraged. We have a long way to go, but I'm confident we will get there as long as we can keep the momentum going."

Amana Population Numbers

According to most recent US Census the population of the State of Iowa is 3.1 million. Officially the population of the seven Amana villages have a combined population of 1548. Village by village the colony population from largest to smallest is: Middle Amana 543 persons; Amana 388; South Amana 165; West 140; Homestead 135; High Amana 113 and East Amana 64.

lowa County has a population of 16,475 men, women and children. It's population is estimated to have dropped by about 200 persons since the most recent census. It is the 45th largest of of lowa's 99 counties. The median income in Iowa County is \$64,720 and 6.6 percent of Iowa County families live in poverty according to the US Bureau of Statistics.

VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Pre-registered voter registration deadline is Monday, September 18, 2023 for this election. Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered - such as voters registering to vote on election day - and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and
