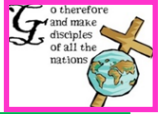

Advent 'Kerygma' Reflection Service: Friday December 6th from 6:30-8:00 pm.

The word Kerygma is a Greek word that means to preach or proclaim. The Kerygma reflection is a way of preaching or proclaiming the Gospel story through Scripture, guided reflection, and music. This reflection leads us through the basic message of salvation in five movements. **1) God is love and has created me for relationship with Him. 2) I have broken my relationship with God with sin. 3) Jesus restores my relationship with God through his life, death, and resurrection 4) Jesus invites me to trust Him; to turn from sin and to give my life to Him. 5) Jesus pours the Holy Spirit into my heart to bring me to new life in His Church. He then sends me on mission to bring the life that I have received to others.** Each of these movements is proclaimed in a reading of Scripture, a very short spoken reflection, and a song. This is a beautiful way to open the season of Advent and to prepare our hearts fully for the coming of Christ on Christmas. **The whole parish is invited to attend!**
