Topic: "Packet Radio/RMS for Emergency Communication"

Packet is in each Delaware hospital. It is ideal for accurate information with no error.

Winlink 2000 is a global system, and can be obtained free of charge. Radio waves can be used when the internet does not work. The system is in use by federal, state, and other structures.

This error free, interoperable system can attach files and lists.

RMS= Radio Message Server (see handout #1: "Sussex County RMS Nodes").

Hams, MARS, and emergency use.

<u>Systems</u>

- 1. Client Systems are typical for home use.
- 2. RMS (Radio Message Server) is placed in the served area.
- 3. Common Messaging System is located around the world.

Hospitals are using Pactor 1, 2, &3.

See handout #2: "Winlink/Winmor".

Winlink is connected via VHF/UHF to the local RMS.

Winmor is connected via HF to a regional RMS or worked direct.

RMS Express software is available in both "Free" and "Preferred" versions. Setup videos are also available in the internet.

Demonstration: Packet at 1200 baud on 145.050 MHz (K3STR) to Nanticoke Hospital.

Other modes: Telnet, Winmor, and Pactor.
