At the third roundabout take Trunk Road south. Go straight through the stoplight, staying on Trunk Road. At the roundabout, turn right onto Blue Lupine. Clinic is on the right approximately 1.1 miles after the roundabout.

COVID-19 INFORMATION

Exhibitors, judges, and volunteers will be required to comply with all State and local mandates in place at the time of the event. The required physical distance for non-family members should be maintained. Walk-throughs may be modified to allow for social distancing. A group potluck will not be held and there will be no group ribbon ceremony. If the entire event must be cancelled because of COVID-19 all entry fees will be refunded.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Dogs with bandages; sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Dogs that are both deaf and blind are able to participate so long as the handler is in control of the dog at all times, the dog can complete the requirements of the class, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

Females in season may not participate, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance may not participate.

ENTRY FEES

*A first entry is defined as a single run by a single dog, in a single day. Additional entries are counted for that day. (Handler Discrimination classes are part of the same trial Saturday & Sunday.) Sunday entries are not additional entries to Saturday. Entry fees include a \$3.50 per run AKC recording fee.

No entries will be accepted by phone, email, fax. Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address. Inquiries may be directed to **JANE KNIGHT** at trialsbybyps@mtaonline.net. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the

WAIT LIST INFORMATION

A wait list will be offered to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of **80 entries per day** will be placed on the club's wait list. All entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to **February 10, 2021**. No entries may be withdrawn with a refund after closing on **February 10, 2021** (except bitches in season, per AKC regulations). If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait listed entry, a full refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry. Any wait listed entry that does not move off the wait list into the trial will receive a full refund.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include crating, warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary's table for check-ins and posting of running order and results. Limited indoor crating will be available.

The **Handler's Briefing** may take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there's an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler's Briefing.

A **warm-up area** will be available. One labelled container per target odor being used in the trial on each day will be placed in the warm-up area. There may also be blank containers. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less so that others may be able to use the warm-up area as well. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior to their run, or for recovery after the run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class.

Search Area Conditions. Searches may be indoors, on matted, carpeted, or tiled surfaces.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

This is a working farm and U-pick vegetable farm. On Saturday there may be employees, as well as farm equipment, moving about in and around the staging and parking areas.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5. Section 35 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area".

Spectator Area. Spectators are encouraged. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be ask to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search until the completion of the class.

Inside Crating space will be available as space permits.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

A **New Title rosette** will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title.

Special Award – “Old Dog, New Tricks”

For any dog over the age of ten (10) years who, per the owner's records, earns their **first** title (element or level) on either Saturday or Sunday, a dog toy donated by Jane Knight in memory of "Ticket", De Fining Moment du Parc Roux-Sel, RI, TD, SCN, CGC, TKI.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Alaska Herding Group Club nor the Obedience Training Club of Chugiak, as well as its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Alaska Herding Group Club and the Obedience Training Club of Chugiak reserve the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against The Alaska Herding Group Club or the Obedience Training Club of Chugiak or any official thereof.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

RINGSIDE

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN: At check-in you will receive your armband number. Once the time and location for check-in is determined all exhibitors will be notified by email.

Exhibitors MUST check-in EACH day they are entered.

Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

"Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations." Additionally, clubs should include any specific local or state health requirements; for example, proof of rabies vaccination.

HOTEL INFORMATION

The following local hotels may allow well-behaved dogs. There may be a limit on the number of dogs allowed. Many of these rooms are also designated as smoking rooms. Animals may not be left in an unoccupied room. Owners are entirely responsible for damage done by their dogs. **Please check rates when inquiring. Rates may vary based on the season. Most require a deposit or fee for dogs.**

DIRECTIONS TO THE TRIAL SITE

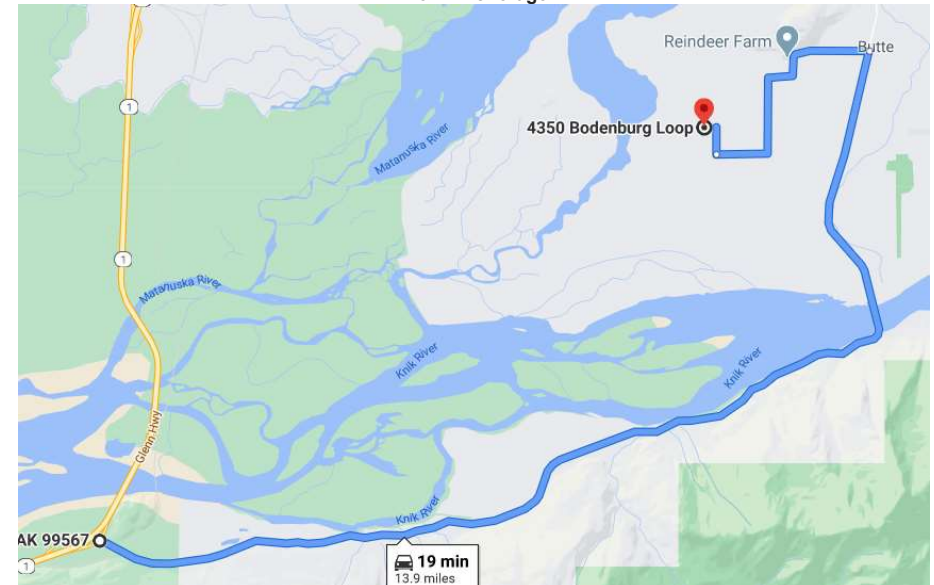
From Anchorage- Glenn Highway to Old Glenn Highway exit. At the top of the ramp, turn right and follow the Old Glenn Highway approximately 11.1 miles. Turn left at the flashing yellow light onto Bodenburg Loop. Follow Bodenburg through five (5) 90-degree turns (the last to the right) approximately 2.6 miles. Turn left into the driveway before the bank of mailboxes.

From Palmer – Arctic Avenue becomes the Old Glenn Hwy. Follow approximately 9.1 miles. Turn right at the flashing yellow light onto Bodenburg Loop. Follow directions above.

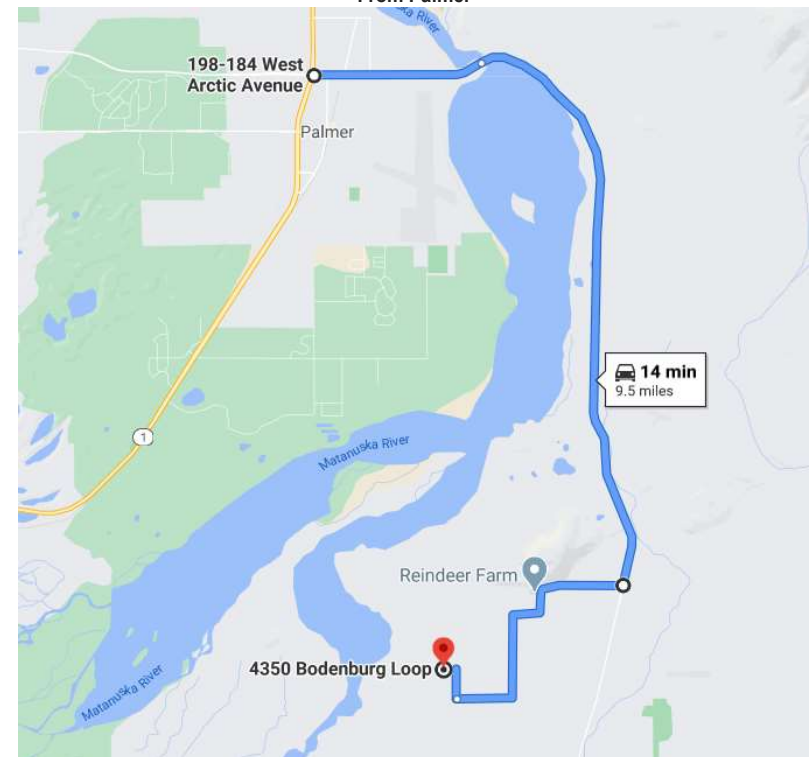
From North of Wasilla - Parks Highway, turn onto Main Street. Turn right onto E. Bogard Road and follow to Palmer. Go straight through the light at the Glenn Highway. That road then becomes Arctic Avenue. Follow directions for Palmer (above).

From East Wasilla – South on Parks Hwy and take the Palmer exit onto the North Glenn Hwy (toward Palmer). Follow the Glenn Hwy north through Palmer. Turn right onto Arctic Avenue and follow the directions for Palmer (above). OR: Palmer-Wasilla Hwy and turn left onto Trunk Road. At the round-about, take the first right onto E. Bogard Road. Follow directions for North of Wasilla (above).

I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim of loss, injury or damage to this dog.
