Arizona has earned the ranking of 44th for worst quality of health care in the U.S.* This is due in part to the large number of uninsured Arizonans, which is five times greater than the national average.

Every day at Mission of Mercy, we strive to meet the ever more complex and growing needs of uninsured people falling through the cracks of our health-care system because they cannot afford the high cost of care.

For the past two and half decades, we've brought solutions into communities that have unmet health-care needs by bringing doctors directly to the people, and healing through Love. But our work is not yet done, and clearly there are many more who need our help.

It's been through the prayers and generosity of countless community health partners, private and corporate funders, individual donors and passionate, dedicated staff and volunteers that we have been able to grow to six clinic sites across Maricopa County.

We remain amazed and grateful for all we have accomplished without charging a single penny for our services, all while remaining 100% privately funded. Since 1997, we have provided nearly 300,000 medical visits and dispensed almost 500,000 prescription medications at no cost to our patients.

As we move into our 25th anniversary year, we do so with grateful hearts and a healthy dose of optimism, knowing that together we can move closer to achieving health equity for all.






Statement of Financial Position as of June 30, 2022 (unaudited)*

Raj's Story

Raj G. grew up on a small African island and at age 60, he had never seen a doctor. He found our Avondale clinic after taking his friend to an appointment. Raj asked our volunteers if he, too, might be able to see a doctor and was surprised when they said yes.

After his first visit, Raj found out he had extremely high cholesterol and Type 2 diabetes. He ended up in a monthlong coma related to complications from his untreated diabetes. After coming out of the coma, he was told he would likely not see, walk or talk again. He did lose vision in one eye, but he can still walk and talk "thanks to the grace of God and my wonderful doctors."

Now 62, Raj has been visiting our Avondale clinic for his medications and checkups every two months, and he adheres to a healthy, vegetable-based diet based on orders from our beloved MOM volunteer Dr. Carie Barlow. "She saved my life, and from the bottom of my heart, I am grateful."







Juanita's Story

Juanita,* 46, came to Mission of Mercy's Chandler clinic with an A1c of 12.8%. Her fasting blood sugar was in the mid-300s and she reported she was in a very dark place mentally. After visiting the ER five times for a dangerous infection that would not heal, she was losing hope. She could not hold a job and her bills were piling up. At her last ER visit, she was referred to Mission of Mercy.

During her first visit to MOM's clinic, she was provided free prescription medications and insulin to help manage her diabetes, and a certified diabetes educator spent time reviewing and stressing the importance of a strict low sugar/carb diet and provided an easy option to get physically active with stretch bands. She also was given a bag of fresh produce and recipes for healthy meals.

Just five months later, Juanita's diabetes is considered controlled with an A1c of 6.3%! She's feeling better physically and mentally, and she also secured a new job.
