Karen was born and raised in the rural northern tier of Maryland, very close to the Mason-Dixon Line in Harford County. One summer during a family rafting trip on the Shenandoah River, their guide was a student from Virginia Tech. The entire trip he raved about what a fantastic college he went to and how much he loved it. He was so convincing, that she applied for early admission and received the acceptance letter a month later on

her birthday. It was the only college she applied to and it turned out to be all she had hoped for and much more!

Although her faith in Jesus started early in life with her grandmother having her memorize the 23rd Psalm at age four, and she was baptized and confirmed in youth, her real understanding started in college. A relentless friend in her dorm insisted she spend many Friday evenings with her at Campus Crusade for Christ. That's when her learning really began and her relationship with Christ grew. 
