Sunday's Reflection

Today's Scripture readings give us all the messages of Advent. Our God is coming! Get ready! Rejoice!

We heard our God speak words of comfort to us in today's first reading. Like a shepherd, he feeds us and gathers us into his arms. While our God comes among us with power

and majesty, he also comes with great tenderness and compassion.

Mark reminds us that God has come to live among us in Jesus. And Jesus will come again in glory to bring us to the banquet which God has prepared for those who love him.

As we wait eagerly for the coming of Jesus and the completion of the kingdom, we are invited to join John the Baptist in preparing the way of the Lord. We are to prepare our own hearts and our world for the return of Jesus.


John reminds us that preparing is repentance, making the road to our heart level and cleared of the stones of selfishness and sin.

That is our daily task as we wait. The eagerness of our longing for Jesus' return ought to manifest itself in our loving concern to the needs of one another. St. Paul reminds us that our concern is to be ready every day for the coming of the Lord. Right now, we can be thankful for the patience of our God. He is giving us time to prepare well for his coming.

As we continue to wait eagerly in prayer during this Advent season, let us use this time well to prepare our hearts and our world for the coming of Jesus among us once again. Rejoice, my brother and sisters! Our God is coming! Let's continue to get ready!

Reflexión Semanal

Las lecturas de Isaías, Marcos y Pedro para este Segundo domingo de Adviento, nos urgen a "preparar el camino del Señor" y a estar listos para el "día de nuestro Señor".

December 10 – 16, 2023

Entrelazado en estas exhortaciones está un llamado a arrepentirnos y a prepararnos para la llegada triunfante de Cristo. Pedro nos recuerda que desconocemos el día o la hora exacta de la llegada de nuestro Señor y que por ello debemos estar constantemente vigilantes, esperando y “comportándonos... de forma santa y devota” (2 Pedro 3, 11). En nuestras primeras dos lecturas hay también un mensaje de consuelo y de esperanza. “Consuelo, consuelo mi pueblo dice su Dios. Diríjanse con ternura a Jerusalén” (Isaías 40, 1-2); “Nuestro Señor no posterga el cumplimiento de su promesa en el sentido en que algunos entienden la palabra “postergar”, él es paciente con ustedes y no desea que ninguno perezca sino que anhela que todos logren el arrepentimiento” (2 Pedro 3, 9)

Juan Bautista es nuestro ejemplo a seguir para este segundo domingo de Adviento. Al mismo tiempo que él predica un mensaje de urgencia y de arrepentimiento, también nos señala el camino hacia la salvación: Jesucristo, nuestro Señor. Nosotros estamos llamados a equilibrar la tensión que existe entre la urgencia de organizar nuestras vidas en preparación para la venida de Cristo, y la esperanza de que Dios nos ama y que se preocupa por nosotros, tanto, que a través de este mismo Cristo El nos envía los dones que necesitamos para realizar nuestra vocación en este mundo con devoción y santidad.

San Francisco de Sales nos llama a enfrentar las tensiones, las urgencias y los trastornos de esta vida con una “confianza perfecta” y a no dejarnos llevar por la su divina providencia” para que “él nos ayude en todas las situaciones. Francisco de Sales nos instruye a “permanecer en paz, liberen su imaginación de todo aquello que los preocupe”. Esta vida puede estar llena de frustraciones, de obstáculos, de golpes. En medio de nuestros esfuerzos por mantenernos enfocados en la Palabra de Dios durante el transcurrir de esta vida llena de ocupaciones y estrés, podemos llegar a hacernos vulnerables a la tentación de abandonar nuestra búsqueda hacia la devoción y la santidad. En este día, en esta época de problemas financieros, de terrorismo internacional, de un incremento del desempleo y de tanta incertidumbre, nosotros podemos llegar a desviar nuestra atención del llamado que nos hace Juan Bautista para que preparemos el camino del Señor, para que no nos perdamos la llegada de Cristo a nuestras vidas, a lo más íntimo de nuestro ser.

Francisco de Sales nos urge a acudir a la oración, a preparar nuestros corazones para que estén en paz al comienzo de cada día, y para volver nuestros ojos hacia Dios varias veces durante el día, especialmente en los

momentos de crisis, y así recibir todo lo que necesitamos para poder sobreponer cualquier problema que se nos presente. Porque Dios es paciente con nosotros y no desea la muerte del pecador, sino que desea que él o ella se arrepientan y puedan vivir en la esperanza. Debemos hallar consuelo en el conocimiento de que no importa lo que venga, Dios está de nuestro lado y El no permitirá que las penas de este mundo nos abrumen siempre y cuando nos entreguemos y entreguemos nuestras vidas a Su providencia.
