

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) Sunday 21 January 2024 Repent and Believe the Good News.

Not frequently, but sometimes times and in ways that have not been anticipated, abrupt changes shake up our lives: a sudden death in a family; an unexpected illness, change or loss of employment after years of experience, the revelation of wrongdoing by a person or leader we've most trusted; war or disasters costing the lives of many. Each of us could fill in the details of a situation where a radical change has forced us to review the ways we live our lives and our involvement in community from different perspectives.

Today's readings take up again the reflections on Christian discipleship that began last week – this time from the perspective of Mark's Gospel. Jesus appears by the Sea of Galilee after John the Baptiser has been arrested and handed over to Herod. Jesus gives a statement of his call to mission as foretold by John. 'The time has come; the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent - (change your ways/views) and believe the Good News.' The presence of God is in the midst of humanity now! Turn back from the past, from ways you have taken for granted and walk God's way with me – live the Good News!

The fishermen by the lake did this, with hearts of faith and without understanding all what might be expected of them and what they might need to face. They turned from their nets and boats — their livelihood(?) - and followed Jesus unhesitatingly into the future. Mark makes great use of a word translated 'at once'. It expresses the absolute and unhesitating nature of their response and trust in Jesus as the bearer of the good news of God's faithfulness and ongoing presence with us.

Responding to the call of Jesus – like all the great decisions of a full and generous life – is not without its cost. We are reminded of this as the four leave behind old securities, conventions and kinsfolk to throw in their lot with Jesus. But discipleship is not about forming an exclusive and secluded organization with selected membership and measured adherence to strict rules, and observances. It is about perceiving the call of Jesus through human events and daily life. We are given an opportunity to grow in integrity, purity of heart and sincere dedication to God which could force us to question many of our motives for our current ways of living. Have we been leading good and honorable lives, simply to appear good and to score points with God or have we been "loving the Lord your God with all your heart and your strength and with all your soul" (Deut 6:5) and "your neighbour as yourself" in changing circumstances of life or at least trying to? It's about responding to and sharing God's love amongst others. That's what Jesus' 'Good News' was about even if it meant laying down his life for them – which He did.

"Ever-living God direct your love within us, That our efforts in the name of your Son May bring humankind to unity and peace."

NEED TO DISPOSE OF A VEHICLE?

Disposal of a car from a deceased estate, or when a family member has had to relinquish their licence or go into residential care, can be a challenging process. Getting a roadworthy, taking photos to advertise on the internet, cleaning and polishing, taking calls (if they come), even finding a garage until a prospective buyer turns up (if indeed they do!).

If you need to dispose of a vehicle from a deceased estate or which is no longer required, could you consider gifting it to the "Lifeboat Foundation", a registered charity with tax deductible status, which for ten years has been providing pastoral and practical support to nearly 150 victims / survivors across Australia of church-related sexual abuse.

Many of these suffer post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), have limited or no employment, and a donated vehicle could vastly improve their quality of life and / or generate funds to assist personal, medical and accommodation needs.
