SPINACH VS. PEPSI

During the late 1930's PEPSI COLA attempted to purchase POPEYE for a Sunday funnies comic strip.

The idea was to have POPEYE drink PEPSI COLA for his strength rather than eat spinach. Unable to agree on a price for POPEYE, PEPSI COLA decided to create their own character. Thus PEPSI and PETE, the PEPSI COLA COPS were born. They appeared in the Sunday funnies from 1940 to 1950 and were used in other PEPSI COLA advertising programs.

1979: "Catch that PEPSI spirit!."

1981: "PEPSI'S got your taste for life!."

1983: "PEPSI now! Take the Challenge!."

COLLECTORS SPOTLIGHT

One of the primary goals of the Pepsi-Cola Collectors Newsletter is to give Pepsi enthusiasts an opportunity to exchange information and ideas with fellow collectors. This column is dedicated to that end. Each newsletter will spotlight a Pepsi-Cola Collector Club Member. In this issue, Bob Stoddard's collection will be featured.

Bob's interest in collecting Pepsi-Cola began with drinking Pepsi: "I bought an old machine for my den to keep my Pepsi in. Then I bought a Pepsi sign to put over the machine. Five years later I had over 400 pieces."

Today, Bob's collection includes such prized pieces as a 1947 bottle radio, a festoon from the 40s, an early 30s cooler, and a rare plaster display of a woman standing next to a bottle of Pepsi. Of all the many tin and cardboard signs, rare cans, bottles, and carriers, his favorite pieces are his paper items: "You can discover more about Pepsi through the comic strips, ads, and company correspondence than with any other medium. These unlock the history of Pepsi-Cola."

As publisher of the Pepsi-Cola Collectors Club Newsletter, Bob hopes to get to know other collectors who share his enthusiasm for Pepsi. Members who are interested in having their collections showcased are invited to send information about themselves and their collection to Bob in care of the Newsletter.

PEPSI-COLA HISTORY

The Pepsi-Cola Radio Jingle was originally a 45 second commercial with spoken words, but with the help of Walter Mack it was cut down to a 15 second musical commercial. The jingle was played over six million times during the 1940s which is why so many people who were around at the time can still remember some of the words.

PEPSI-COLA RADIO JINGLE

Pepsi-Cola hits the spot, Twelve full ounces, that's a lot, Twice as much for a nickel, too, Pepsi-Cola is the drink for you.

The Pepsi-Cola Radio Jingle was written by Austen Croom-Johnson and Alan Kent. The above is the first of three verses written.

PEPSI-COLA FACTS

Caleb Bradham founded Pepsi-Cola in 1898 in New Bern, North Carolina.

Charles G. Guth was first President of the reorganzied Pepsi-Cola Company in 1931.

1933 Pepsi-Cola introduced 12 ounce bottle for 5¢.

Pepsi-Cola syrup sales for 1931, 1932, and 1933 were about \$100,000.

May 1938 Pepsi-Cola signs exclusive contract with the Skywriting Corporation of America, and begins advertising across the New York skyline.

Pepsi-Cola's advertising budget for 1934 was \$600,000 by 1947 it had increased to \$4,500,000.

1938 Walter S. Mack Jr. becomes President of Pepsi-Cola Company.

1940 Pepsi-Cola introduces a new bottle to be identified by "Pepsi-Cola" blown into the glass in block letters and perpendicular columns on the bottle's upper half, the bottom of the bottle had a paper label until later in the 40s.
