

From US 31 North To MI 60: Turn LEFT onto M 12 heading west. Continue driving on M-12 to New Buffalo, Michigan. Turn LEFT on to E. Buffalo Street. Turn RiGHT onto MI 239 which becomes N Whittaker St. Turn LEFT onto W Water St. 111 W Water Street is on the LEFT.

From Western Avenue which is IN-2 W: IN-2 W becomes US 20 W. Continue on US-20 W and turn RIGHT onto IN-39 (crossing into Michigan). IN-39 becomes MI-239. MI-239 becomes N Whittaker St. Turn LEFT on to W Water St. 111 W Water St is on the LEFT.

Link Leslie Wesley pulled together a small group of parents and community leaders, who drove to Indianapolis March 24th to meet with state schools Superintendent Tony Bennett to make sense of the dilemma at Bendix, Riley and Washington high schools. Link Wesley said she wanted to learn "what, as parents, we could do to make South Bend schools successful."

Link Wesley counts herself among those who were confused by "mixed message" they were hearing locally about the state's action. At the same time, she noted all of the buzz about the \$8.2 million in budget cuts that the South Bend Community School Corp. is trying to make. School closures and layoffs are possible.

"You can imagine how everyone is feeling," said Link Wesley, who teaches five sessions of a financial literacy class on Tuesdays at Washington. "Too much is going on," she said. "I'm concerned that nothing is going to be taken care of properly."

So, she called Bennett's office. He agreed to meet with the group for an hour. Up to 10 people met with Bennett.
