Opinion: Here's What an Almost Perfect Tax-Reform Plan Looks Like

As April 15 approaches, many Americans would welcome a simpler tax plan.

Sen. Mike Lee, a Republican from Utah, and Sen. Marco Rubio, a Republican from Florida, who is about to declare his candidacy for president, have published a draft tax plan with only two rates and an expanded child credit.

But under their plan, tax rates will rise on some singles and married couples without dependent children. As Lee and Rubio refine their plan, they should consider adjusting the rates and tax brackets so that no group gets a tax increase.

According to
CNS News,
Americans will
have to work
from January 1
through April
24 just to pay
taxes!

Everyone agrees that simpler is better. Lee and Rubio suggest replacing the current set of seven individual income tax rates ranging from 10% to 39.6% with two rates, 15% and 35%. They get rid of the alternative minimum tax, which now layers a second tax system on top of the basic one. They end the marriage penalty, because their tax bracket for two people is twice as high as the bracket for one person. They get rid of the complexities of interest: It would be no longer counted as income nor deductible as an expense, except for some mortgage payments. Children get an additional tax credit of \$2,500, a credit that is refundable against income taxes and payroll taxes.

April 4, 1949 - Twelve nations signed the <u>treaty</u> creating NATO, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. The nations united for common military defense against the threat of expansion by Soviet Russia into Western Europe.

April 4, 1968 - Civil Rights leader Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King was shot and killed by a sniper in Memphis, Tennessee.

April 9, 1866 - Despite a veto by President <u>Andrew Johnson</u>, the Civil Rights Bill of 1866 was passed by Congress granting blacks the rights and privileges of U.S. citizenship.

April 11, 1968 - A week after the assassination of Martin Luther King, the Civil Rights Act of 1968 was signed into law by President Lyndon B. Johnson. The law prohibited discrimination in housing, protected civil rights workers and expanded the rights of Native Americans.

April 14, 1865 - President <u>Abraham Lincoln</u> was shot and <u>mortally wounded</u> while watching a performance of *Our American Cousin* at Ford's Theater in Washington.

April 17, 1961 - A U.S.-backed attempt to overthrow Premier Fidel Castro of Cuba failed disastrously in what became known as the Bay of Pigs fiasco.

April 22, 1864 - "In God We Trust" was included on all newly minted U.S. coins by an Act of Congress.

April 25, 1967 - The first law legalizing abortion was signed by Colorado Governor John Love, allowing abortions in cases in which a panel of three doctors unanimously agreed.

April 30, 1789 - George Washington became the first U.S. President as he was administered the oath of office on the balcony of Federal Hall at the corner of Wall and Broad Streets in New York City.
