

Clarence Schock Memorial Park at Governor Dick

is a natural area that covers more than 1100 acres. Originally used for making charcoal for nearby furnaces, the forest today provides habitat for many kinds of animal and bird species. In addition to more than 14 miles of hiking, biking, and horse trails, the Observation Tower draws visitors to a view of five counties on a clear day. 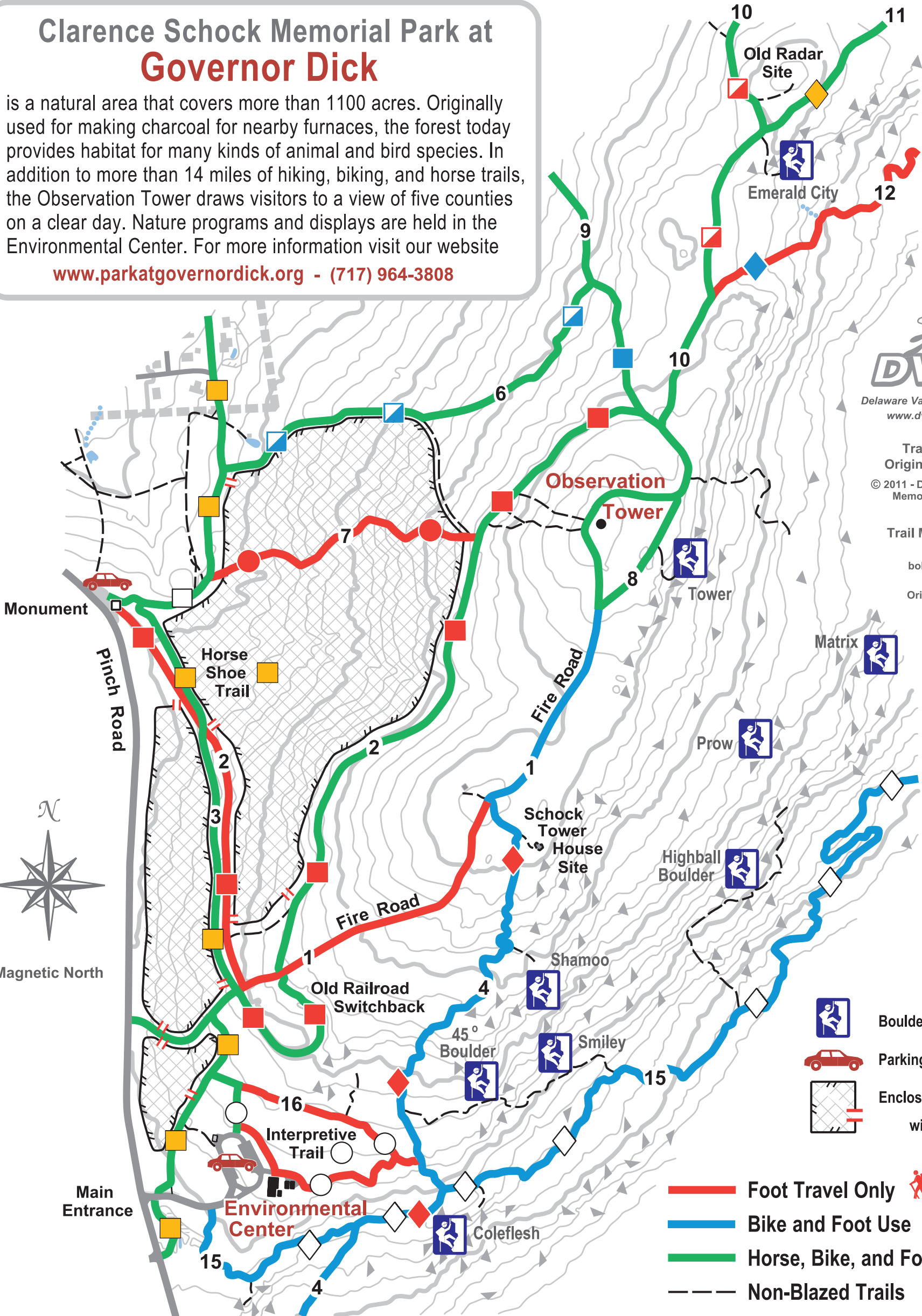


Trail Map Based on Original Orienteering Map
