February begins and the rains pull back for a moment. I hope that the recent deluge hasn't caused our members undue stress or distress. In beautiful Sothern California, we are not accustomed to so much rain in such a short time. If you or a fellow Legionnaire, find themselves displaced from home due to a declared National Disaster, the Legion may be able to help through the American Legion National Emergency Fund:

Eligibility

- Eligibility open to Legionnaires and Sons of the American Legion members (up to \$3,000).
- Applicant must have been displaced from their primary residence due damage sustained during a declared natural disaster. If emergency/disaster shelters are available, and applicant chooses not to stay at shelter, need to know the reason why they did not stay in the shelter.
- Not meant to replace or repair items, only to meet most immediate needs (i.e., temporary housing, food, water, clothing, diapers, etc.) during the period immediately following the disaster.
- Does not cover insurance compensation or monetary losses from a business, structures on your property (barns, tool sheds, etc.,) equipment or vehicles.
- Membership must be active at time of disaster and the time of application.

Application requirements

- Application must be submitted to the Department Headquarters within 90 days of disaster.
- Disaster must be a "declared" natural disaster for Legion Family members.
- Supporting data (photos, receipts, repair estimates, etc.) should be included if at all possible or statements (testimony) from post/district/department officers attesting to damages to residence requiring displacement.
- Only one grant per household per disaster.

American Legion Baseball. The Legion has sponsored baseball since 1925 and it continues locally. Many professional baseball players have come from Legion Baseball. Four Chaplains Service. American Legion District 29 with the Sponsorship of the Orange County Cemetery District invites everyone to the Annual Four Chaplains Memorial Service at Old Santa Ana Cemetery, 1919 East Santa Clara Ave., Santa Ana 92706 on Saturday, February 4, 2023 at 10:30 AM. This will be the 80th Anniversary honoring the US Army Transport Dorchester and the selfless acts of four chaplains. A German U-Boat fired a torpedo that struck the Dorchester, killing 672 of the 902 officers and enlisted men, merchant seamen, and civilian workers aboard. Many of those survivors owed their lives to the courage and leadership of four chaplains onboard: Rev. George Fox (Methodist); Rabbi Alexander Goode (Jewish); Rev. Clark Poling (Dutch Reformed); and Father John Washington (Roman Catholic).

Preamble, Clause 7. As I promised in last Bugle issue, each issue I will review one of the ten clauses (pledges) of the Legion Preamble that we recite at each Legion function. Last issue I reviewed the sixth clause. The seventh one is "**TO COMBAT THE AUTOCRACY OF BOTH THE CLASSES AND THE MASSES**".

The official Legion Headquarters interpretation of this clause is that "This clause places the Legionnaire on the side of right in opposing autocracy by either class or mass when this threatens. In a democracy such as ours, composed as it is of all nationalities, races, creeds and economic groups, there are bound to both classes and masses. Indeed, the masses are composed of classes-but all groups within the mass must feel assured that in this nation, reason and fairness will prevail in all human activities and relations. **There must be no hyphenated Americans-just Americans all.**" Emphasis added. Post 132 certainly lives up to this.

Happy Valentine's Day!!!

Finally, remember our mutual commitment to the Preamble to the American Legion Constitution and the Legion's Four Pillars (Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation; National Security; Americanism; Children & Youth); and most of all remember our commitment to our National Constitution and Country though if you are a veteran, that reminder is normally not necessary.

Post 132 continues to operate ever mindful of any and all legalities. Should you become aware of some potential legal problem for the Post, please inform me at your earliest opportunity so it can be addressed. If I can be of any help to you, feel free to contact me 24/7/365.

STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL

It's not mentioned nearly enough, but more than 20,000 women enlisted and served as nurses in the U.S. Army during World War I. They were often recruited by the American Red Cross to serve in military hospitals in the U.S. and overseas, although some were assigned near battlefields where combatants' lives were more likely to be saved near the front, rather than at far away base hospitals.

Post 132 has three U.S. Army Nurses on the World War I wall, including **Grace Phyllis Auten**. Born April 1, 1890 in Colorado, Grace arrived in Orange County sometime between 1900-1910, when census records show her living in Fullerton with her older brother and his wife, along with their 73-year-old dad.

We can't say for certain what gave Grace the determination, drive and courage to become a U.S. Army Nurse, but one potential factor was her upbringing in a Veteran household. Her father, John Washington Auten, fought in the Civil War (Union side) in the 2nd Illinois Light Artillery between 1861-1864.

It's not entirely clear when Grace's nursing career started, or when she began service as an Army Nurse, but U.S. Veterans Administration Master Index records indicate she was discharged on March 21, 1919, more than four months after the end of the war.

One thing we do know: Grace served at least part of her wartime service in France. U.S. Army transport records indicate that in January 1919, two months after armistice, Grace traveled from USA Base Hospital #2008 in Pandagure France to Polyalinia Hamita

Miss Grace T. Auten, and Mr. S. H. Berd, both of tals city, were married last night at the home of Mrs. Emily V. Reed of Orange.

pital #208 in Bordeaux, France to Polyclinic Hospital in New York City.

In May 1921, 31-year-old Grace Auten became Grace Berg when she married Sigurd Harold Berg, 27, a carpenter who at one time worked at the Naval Hospital in Long Beach. They were married at the home of the mother of two World War I Veterans from Orange.



One year after marriage, Grace and Sigurd had a daughter, Phyllis. Over the following five years, they followed up with two additional sons, Richard Harold Berg and Robert Auten Berg, the latter of whom would eventually serve in the Navy during World War II.

After the completion of her service in the U.S. Army Nurse Corps, Grace lived what appears to be an ordinary, unassuming suburban life in Anaheim. She passed away at the age of 67 on December 26, 1957 (we don't know the cause of death). Her husband lived another 22 years, until he too passed in 1979. They are interred together at Melrose Abbey Memorial Park in Anaheim. We thank you for your service and pay tribute for all you did to support American World War I servicemen, Nurse Grace Auten Berg.


