

Liturgical Reflection

Today is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. The Christian world begins its holiest of weeks. Today we enter the sacred city Jerusalem where our Lord is met with shouts of Hosannas, only later to be handed over to crucifixion and death. Lent will end this week before the great Three Days of the Lord's death and resurrection. Can you name what must die in your life so that new life can enter? For forty days we have fasted, prayed, and given alms. We will die with the Lord, only to rise with him. For the living and the dead, these are the days commemorating our salvation in Jesus Christ. Death and resurrection ground our faith. We dare to enter the holy city to die and rise with our Lord.

Fucharistic Ministers and Servers

All Eucharistic Ministers and Servers are to be present March 29 for Holy Thursday Service and will meet in the Annex at 6:40 p.m.



On Holy Thursday, March 29, the Church celebrates the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This liturgy recalls the day the Lord gathered with His disciples in the Upper Room to institute the Eucharist and the Priesthood. It was there that Jesus gave His followers the commandment "to love one another as I have loved you." He exemplified this love by washing the feet of the disciples. The washing of feet will be included in our Mass.

As a sign of their liturgical ministry, all Eucharistic Ministers and Servers are asked to participate in the Entrance Procession at this Mass. They are to gather in the Annex at 6:40 p.m. The blessed oils will also be part of the Offertory Procession at this Mass. The three oils will then be placed in the ambry. After Mass, the Eucharist will be transferred to a place of reposition where the Faithful are encouraged to continue adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. Adoration will follow until midnight.

Good Friday Fast and Abstinence

The ancient fast honors the suffering and death of the Lord, and prepares us to share more deeply in the mystery of the Resurrection. Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from eating meat on Good Friday; those 18 to 59, are to fast (limit themselves to one full meal) as well.



On Good Friday, March 30, the Church recalls the day the Lord surrendered Himself totally to the will of His Heavenly Father by obediently accepting death on the Cross. He has shown us the way to the Father through His openness to the Father's love. Christ invites us to follow Him for He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Our Good Friday Service, which includes the Liturgy of the Word, the Veneration of the Cross, and Holy Communion, will be celebrated at 1 p.m.

Tenebrae Service

The ancient Tenebrae Service dates back to the early years of the Church. From the Latin word meaning "darkness" Tenebrae recalls — through music, Scripture readings and the extinguishing of candles — the light of the disciples and the crucifixion. The Service begins on Good Friday at 7:30 p.m.
