



NIAGARA COUNTY; Four members of the Niagara Jr. Thunderwolves 2019 Showcase team have signed to play Collegiate Summer Baseball for the 2020 season.

Mitchell Pascarella, a right handed pitcher from Southwestern High School who is signed to play at the University of Connecticut, has signed to play for the Jamestown Jammers. The Jammers are members of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League. Jamestown won the PGCBL in 2018 before a year hiatus, and are set to return for the 2020 season. The Jammers play at historic Russell E. Diethrick, Jr. Park. The PGCBL is an independent summer collegiate league.

The other three Jr. Thunderwolves have all signed to play in the New York Collegiate Baseball League, members of the National Alliance of College Summer Baseball.

The NACSB is an alliance of non-profit summer collegiate baseball leagues that are each partially funded by Major League Baseball. Members of the NACSB provide a platform for elite college baseball players to compete at a high level. Players are bound by NCAA eligibility and are sent to each member league by their college coach.

Iroquois senior right handed pitcher, Nick Partsch, has signed to play with the Niagara Power. The Power are the 2019 NYCBL Champions, and play their home games at historic Sal Maglie Stadium. Partsch has signed his National Letter of Intent to Siena College.

While the pair of Niagara University commitments in infielder Liam Ward (Albion), and catcher Nicholas Castellana (Lancaster) have signed to play for the Olean Oilers. The Oilers won back-to-back NYCBL Championships in 2015-2016, and play their home games at Bradner Stadium.
