



World Day of Prayer for Priests, Friday, June 28

WILL YOU PLEASE STOP TELLING THE KIDS THAT I ATE US OUT OF HOUSE AND HOME

Introduction:1) The last two precious gifts given to us by Jesus are the Holy Eucharist as our spiritual food on Holy Thursday and Jesus' mother Mary as our spiritual Mother on Good Friday 2) Corpus Christi is the celebration of the abiding presence of a loving God as Emmanuel – Godwith-us – in order to give collective thanks to our Lord for his living with us in the Eucharist. 3) The feast also gives us an occasion to learn more about the importance and value of the "Real Presence" so that we may appreciate it and better and receive maximum benefit from the Sacrament.

Life messages: God created us with desires and longs to see us satisfied. Because of sin and brokenness, we often learn to satiate desires with things that don't ultimately satisfy. Built over time into habits, we can spend long seasons of our lives settling for things that leave us wanting. This is the heart of addiction, and we are all addicted to something: food or TV, control or selfrighteousness, drugs or alcohol. On this feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus, we read about the miracle of feeding the five thousand. While the disciples would send the people away to find food, Jesus insists on giving the people what they need. When the leftovers are gathered, the Gospel says: "They all ate and were satisfied." We may think of one area in our life where we are constantly eating or seeking but are never satisfied. We may ask God to help us identify the heart of that desire, and seek out the supports we need to feed the desire in a way that truly satisfies us and Him.

- 1) <u>Let us appreciate the "Real Presence"</u> of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, by receiving Him with true repentance for our sins, due preparation and reverence and spending time adoring him in the Blessed Sacrament.
- 2) Let us be Christ-bearers and conveyers: By receiving Holy Communion, we become Christ-bearers as Mary was, with the duty of conveying Christ to others at home and in the workplace, through love, mercy, forgiveness and humble and sacrificial service.
- 3) Let us offer our lives on the altar along with Jesus' sacrifice, asking pardon for our sins, expressing gratitude for the blessings we have received and presenting our needs and petitions on the altar and by receiving him with due preparation in Holy Communion.

June 23rd, 2019 - Body and Blood of Christ -<u>Stewardship Reflection</u> – St. Augustine said, "We hear 'Body of Christ' and we say 'Amen!'. Be a member of the Body of Christ so that your 'Amen' may be the truth". We are what we receive; we are the Body of Christ. As a member of the Body of Christ we are called to exercise good stewardship of who we say we are. It begins in Holy Communion and continues when we leave the church and go out into the world. The stewardship lifestyle is a reflection of our 'Amen.'
