Federal Levee Risk Data Explained

FEMA recently released an <u>informational document</u> describing the approach they took in setting new flood insurance rates for Risk 2.0, the datasets they relied on, and what they did in the absence of information. The Association is concerned the data and methodology being employed by FEMA will result in inaccurate ratings for Central Valley in terms of levee performance and overtopping. There is a need for the state to fund the review and development of updated levee performance and overtopping information for the State Plan of Flood Control system and then submit to FEMA as the most accurate and current levee status to be used for calculating the NFIP insurance rates.

New Forecasting and Real-Time Water Conditions

Using data from <u>DWR</u>, the National Weather Service, and other sources, a new California <u>Water Watch website</u> is providing local and statewide water conditions, both <u>flood and drought</u>, with real-time information down to the neighborhood level.

Passing of Two Central Valley-Delta Water Leaders

On January 26, 2022, former CCVFCA Executive Director Robert <u>"Bob" Clark passed away</u> in his sleep after battling cancer. Before working for the Association from 1995-2005, Bob had a 25-year career as manager of the Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District. In addition, a champion of the Delta and leader in the agricultural community, Dean "Dino" <u>Cortopassi</u>, passed away in mid-February after complications from a stroke.

Congressman Josh Harder <u>announced</u> the <u>Lower San Joaquin flood control plan</u> will receive \$35 million from the federal <u>Infrastructure Investments and Jobs Act</u> to improve levees protecting Manteca, Lathrop, and greater Stockton from flooding.
