Dressage Payment, Entry and Show Day Information

Rules:

<u>Proof of Rabies Vaccine and a current negative Coggins test required.</u> Submit with entry. Once on file, no need to resubmit.

Note Trainers and Farms may not pay for student's registration with one check. Family members may pay with one check.

Fees: Dressage tests \$25 per test; Suitability and Equitation classes \$5 per class Grounds Fee, Office Fee \$5, \$5 WRC members exempt.

<u>Pre-registration is required</u>: Entries with payment are accepted on a first come first served basis. Ride times will be posted on the website Thursday before the show. If you do not receive your ride times by Thursday p.m. please contact Amy at 570-660-5085.

Must be postmarked a minimum of 10 days prior to the show. Please use a separate entry for each show and horse/rider combination. Please make checks payable to WRC. Remit completed entry form and payment to address in box at right. We are expecting a large turn out

this year. Get your entries in early. Riders that do not get a ride time will be placed on a waiting list. No refunds for scratched classes, unless illness or injury to rider or equine. Dr. or Vet verification required.

Breaking a tie: Ties within a division will be broken by the most number of blue ribbons, then red, etc...

Attire and Gear:

Classes' 1-14 USEF Dressage rules apply 2015-2018 USEF and USDF Tests will be used. Snaffle bits only, no martingales, tie downs or other training devises allowed. Boot with a heel (no lugged soles. ASTM riding helmet are required.

Classes' 15-24 USEF Western Dressage rules and tests apply. Non-ASTM headgear is permitted.

Day-End High Point Division Awards: Eleven Day end high point divisions are available. A championship and reserve will be awarded in each division. To qualify for a day end high-point championship award for this series, riders will collect points in the indicated classes below.

 $1^{st} = 6$ points $2^{nd} = 5$ points $3^{rd} = 4$ points $4^{th} = 3$ points $5^{th} = 2$ points $6^{th} = 1$ point along with one point for every class entered within the division. Riders must ride <u>two</u> eligible tests in a level to be eligible for a high point division award.

Series Year End High Point Awards: Points will be tallied for each of the three shows. A champion and a reserve will be awarded in each division. If competition is heavy a 3rd place may be awarded. The horse/rider combination collecting the highest number of points within all three show will be the champion. The Year-end awards banquet on Saturday November 4th, 2017.

Dressage Year End WRC Member High Point Awards: Two Divisions, Junior rider age 14 and under and Senior 15 and over. Grand and reserve will be awarded in both divisions. For overall year end Dressage member awards, all points from this show series, along with one point for every class entered, will count for the appropriate age high point (Ages as of 1/1/17). To qualify memberships must be received at or before show earning points. See website and membership form for other member qualifications.

Dressage Seat Equitation: These classes are judged on the rider's position, seat and specifically the correct use and effect of the aids. The riders will go into the ring and simultaneously perform each gait at the judge's direction. The riders will be judged on equitation that is expected to be seen in a dressage test.

Dressage Suitability: To be held as a flat class with all horses in the arena together. The riders will go into the ring and simultaneously perform each gait at the judge's direction. Horses will be judged and placed for the horse most suitable for dressage.

Baroque Dressage Shows: They will be run as a separate show. You may cross enter into both shows. Please advise Amy and Harry Zimmerman 570-244-5472 that you are competing in both so they can coordinate scheduling.
