Today we focus on the Lord's return at the end of time. In the apocalyptic discourse in Saint Luke's Gospel, Jesus describes the troubles that will happen before he comes again in glory: countries will fight other countries, earthquakes will destroy cities, people will starve,



and sicknesses will cause many people to die. If we were to predict the end times by the number of such disasters in our world today, we would think the end is already here. But we never really know only God knows for sure. Meanwhile, we are asked to live our lives following the imperatives of Jesus in the Gospel: do not be led astray, do not be afraid; rather give Christian witness and endure. As we await the Lord's return, let us open our eyes to the tragedies of our time, not to be prophets of misfortune, but courageous prophets of a new order based on justice and peace.

November 15 - Memorial of Saint Albert the Great, Bishop, Doctor: Born in Swabia about 1206, Albert earned a doctorate and taught theology. In recognition of his intellectual gifts, he received the title 'Great' from his contemporaries. Albert is best known for adapting for theologians Aristotle's works in philosophy and logic. He initiated the Scholastic method (application of Aristotelian methods to Christian doctrine) and his student, Thomas Aquinas, developed this method at length. Albert died in 1280 and was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1931. He is a patron saint of scientists.

November 16 - Memorial of Saint Margaret of Scotland: Margaret married Malcolm Canmore, King of Scotland, in 1070. To her husband and his country she brought the best of European culture and encouraged many by her life of Christian virtue. She worked for justice and improved conditions for the poor; she also guided the Celtic church toward strong ties with Rome, rebuilt churches, and brought the Benedictines to Scotland. She gave birth to eight children and was a model of motherhood. She was canonized in 1251 and named a patron saint of Scotland in 1673.

Report on the Synodal Process



It was with gratitude to Pope Francis that the Diocese of Grand Falls began its Immaculate Conception. Based on responses heard and recorded, it was decided to create two reports: one to be forwarded to the Atlantic Basic at our own diocesan and parish levels. In the coming weeks, in the Sunday bulletin, you will be provided with the second report (condensed version) of the parish responses that

were forwarded to the Atlantic Region.

1. Leadership

- Trust in the church and its hierarchy has been eroded
- Modernize the views of the church as it relates to science and medicine for example invitrofertilization
- Provide new and increased opportunities for leadership roles for women
- Ensure equality of opportunity for men and women
- Modernize and review church policies
- Hold people in authority accountable for their actions
- Permit priests to marry
- Ordain women.
- Ordain female deacons
- Recognize/bless same sex marriages
- Recognize divorce. Annulment is a long and expensive process
- Enhanced outreach to youth, to the LGBTQ2 community, to those who feel alienated, to lapsed Catholics.

NOVEMBER 13 - WORLD DAY OF THE POOR: In 2017, Pope Francis instituted the World Day of the Poor so that 'throughout the world Christian communities can become an ever greater sign of Christ's charity for the least and those most in need."

NOVEMBER 17 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY, RELIGIOUS: Also known as Elizabeth of Thuringia, Saint Elizabeth was born in 1207 to King Andrew II of Hungary and Gertrude of Andechs-Meran. At age four, she was betrothed to Ludwig of Thuringia and sent to live in his family's castle. They married when Elizabeth was 14, and by all accounts enjoyed a happy though brief life together. Elizabeth built hospitals to care for the needy and the sick, but many of the nobles resented the expense. When her husband died of the plaque while away on a crusade, Elizabeth was accused of mismanagement and had to leave Wartburg. Having made provision for her children, Elizabeth entered the Third Order of Saint Francis and spent her days caring for the sick, the aged and the poor. Renowned for her prayer, her works of charity, her spirit of penance and great gentleness, she died at Marburg in 1231 at the age of 24 and was canonized by Pope Gregory IX in 1235. She is a patron saint of the Franciscan Third Order and of Catholic charities.
