The Orange International Street Fair is here. This is our most significant and important fundraising event of the year and we are ready. Here are some important things to remember.

1. Current members of our Post, Auxiliary, SAL and Riders may park in the South parking lot for free, but you must show a current membership card from your parent organization.
2. Members of other Posts or legion families will be required to make the \$10 parking donation and park in the North parking lot — based on space availability.
3. Members of our Post and our Legion families with current membership cards will not be required to pay the cover charge for the evening events in the clubroom, but you must show a current membership card.
4. Security will be covering all entrances and checking for valid member cards and IDs. There will be Post and Family unit officers onsite during the entire event. Please treat them all with courtesy.

The most important message in this article is simple. You must have your valid, current membership card from this Post or one of our 132 Post Legion Family Units to park free and have a cover charge waived. If you need a current card, contact me ASAP so I can get you a card. I am working very hard to get cards distributed for the new Legion year.

I still have members asking why their renewal notice says they have been a member since 2022. As I noted in my last article, as Susan shared in an email to the members and as I have shared at the last couple of meetings, this was an error by the marketing company that the National Legion hired to handle the distribution. Your member year numbers are correct in the My Legion system. No, the mailer cannot be corrected and remailed. The Member card that I send you once you pay renewal dues will have the correct number of years. This should not recur, but we all know Murphy's Law. Again, show some grace and courtesy to the folks who are processing member renewals. There are 600 members at 132 and just one Adjutant. There are about 8,000 Legion members in Orange County and every one of them are experiencing the same delays.

Thanks for hearing me out and for understanding. September is going to be exciting so I look forward to seeing you at our Post.

Comrades and Friends!

As Post Judge Advocate, I believe it is my responsibility to always seek ways to minimize our Post exposure to any likely (or even unlikely) risks. Many of the formalities you see at the Post are our effort to prevent problems: Clear rental contracts, bar of drinks on the dance floor, regular updating of licenses and maintenance schedules, exterior lighting, etc. If you are challenged about some seemingly annoying rule, remember we are trying to protect your investment – this Post. If you see something risky, let me or any Post officer know quickly so we can address the matter.

As you read this, I will have returned from the 103rd American Legion National Convention in Milwaukee, a gathering of all the 55 departments of the Legion. In the next Bugle issue, I will try to report on developments from the Convention.

Every Legionnaire recites the Preamble to the American Legion Constitution at the beginning of each official meeting. It consists of ten clauses. Though the meaning of most is obvious, some are not clear and some of you might appreciate or need some explanation. Each issue of the Bugle, I will start reviewing the clauses. The first is “FOR GOD AND COUNTRY, WE ASSOCIATE OURSELVES TOGETHER...” Past National Adjutant Mike MAXA explains that “This is the introduction. It declares that The American Legion recognizes the influence of Almighty God in all worthwhile endeavors-and declares the allegiance of Legionnaires to both God and Nation. First things have been put first. All that follows is in conformity.” I think that clause and explanation is pretty clear and easy to understand and needs nothing more from me.

Finally, remember our mutual commitment to the Preamble to the American Legion Constitution and the Legion’s Four Pillars (Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation; National Security; Americanism; Children & Youth); and most of all remember our commitment to our National Constitution and Country though if you are a veteran, that reminder is normally not necessary. If I can be of any help to you, feel free to contact me 24/7/365.

STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL



Orville Jennings Nordeen was born in Nebraska on January 27, 1897. He was the youngest of five children born to Swedish immigrant and shoemaker Jonas Nordeen and his wife Sigrid. Sometime between 1910 and 1918, the Nordeens and their three youngest kids relocated to Orange. They lived in a home on S. Grand Street between Chapman and Almond (on property that was razed in the early 1960s for the construction of the current Orange City Hall).

In 1918, during the 4th year of World War I, Orville was studying dentistry at the University of Southern California when he was summoned by the draft board in Los Angeles. He was drafted into the Marine Corps effective August 2, 1918 (no one knew the war would be over two months later).

According to Marine Corps muster rolls, Orville was first stationed at Mare Island, California. Two months later he was attached to the Marines' 187th com-

pany, 15th regiment at the Marine barracks in Quantico, Virginia. In early 1919, he was discharged three months after the World War I armistice.

After his service in the Marine Corps, he completed his dentistry degree. In 1921, he married Hortense L. Fulton, the daughter of a fruit grower. Their first home was near the intersection of Parker and Almond, a seven-minute walk from our Post.

By 1930, Orville and Hortense were living in Los Angeles where he ran a dentistry practice in downtown L.A. Hortense worked alongside him as a secretary and dental nurse.

Dr. O. J. Nordeen, Bass Lake Dentist, Dies In Fresno

Dr. O. J. Nordeen, 59, a dentist in Bass Lake, Madera County, the past four years, died last night in a local hospital.

He was a native of Nebraska, but came to California when a boy. He attended schools in the Los Angeles area and was graduated from the University of Southern California.

He practiced in Orange County and in Los Angeles for more than 30 years before moving to Bass Lake. He was a member of the Orange Grove Masonic Lodge in Southern California.

He is survived by his widow, Hortense; a sister, Mrs. Goldie Robinson of Orange, and two brothers, Ansel of Long Beach and Carl of Washington, DC.

The funeral services will be announced by the Lisle Funeral Home.



In 1949, after 30 years of practice in Orange and Los Angeles County, Orville and Hortense moved to Bass Lake, California. In 1956, at the far-too-young age of 59, Orville transferred Post Everlasting. We don't know the cause of death, but he had been hospitalized prior. According to his obituary published in local papers, he was survived by his widow (who joined him at Post Everlasting 14 years later), a sister and two brothers. There are no records of the Nordeens having any children.

Thank you, Orville Nordeen, for your service in the U.S. Marine Corps.

How 'Gold Star' Came to Be

The tradition of the Gold Star began during World War II. During the early days of the war, a blue star was used on service flags and hung in homes and businesses to represent each living active-duty member. As men were killed in combat, the gold star was superimposed on the blue star to honor the person for his ultimate sacrifice to the country. Eventually, the mothers of those fallen service members became known as Gold Star Mothers, and their families Gold Star Families.
