#### HELPING OTHERS

would like to ask you a question, and I'd like you to take a few moments to think about it carefully: Have you ever helped anybody?

It can be something small or something big. Simply bring to mind all the various ways in which you have helped others – and I imagine over the years you will have gathered hundreds of examples.

You may have helped a toddler when they fell, or a child with their homework; perhaps you gave someone a lift in your car or offered your seat on public transport. Have you ever donated to charity? Or taken part in a fundraiser? Or lit a candle for someone who was struggling?

Maybe you have lent a listening ear to a friend, or comforted someone who was grieving; perhaps you have lent money to a family member, or let your neighbour borrow your lawnmower, or toolset, or some other thing that belonged to you.

I have no doubt that every single person reading this will have answered "Yes" to my question. Yes, there have been times when you have helped others.

#### ASKING FOR HELP

hy is it then, that so many of us struggle when it comes to reaching out and asking for help for ourselves? How can we feel so ready and willing to jump in and help someone else, yet hesitate and resist asking for help when we ourselves need it?

Maybe it's pride. Maybe it's fear of appearing weak or needy. Maybe it's denial. Maybe we don't want to admit that we can't do it by ourselves. Maybe asking for

help makes us feel like we have somehow failed. Maybe it's embarrassment, or shame. Maybe we've been so self-sufficient for so long that we don't know how to ask. It could be any of these things, or it could be some other reason.

The truth of the matter is that life catches all of us short from time to time. We all run into difficulties, we all face problems, we all have worries and concerns that can leave us feeling helpless. In that moment, it takes courage to reach out and ask for help, and it is a sign of strength.

#### GOD'S HELP

o, where do we go to when we need assistance?
Where do we turn to for help? I suggest there are two places: we can look around us towards others, and we can look above us towards heaven. The beautiful thing is that God is present in both. God is our constant companion (Mt 28:20), he sends others into our life to support and strengthen us (Rom 12:13), and he promises to respond whenever we seek him (Lk 11:9).

I don't know what kind of problem you may be facing right now, or what obstacle looms before you, but in your moment of need or helplessness, do not hesitate to take a deep breath and call out "Lord, help me," and God, who has counted every hair on your head (Lk 12:7), will immediately run to your aid. Know that when you ask God for help, God hears you, and God sees you, and "so we can say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper'" (Heb 13:6). Let us never forget how much God cares for us, and let each of us pray, "Lord, help me."

## GOD'S WORD TODAY

Acts 9:26-31 1 Jn 3:18-24 Jn 15:1-8 During the Last Supper, Jesus uses the symbol of the vine to teach his followers about the true meaning of discipleship. He begins by describing how vines are cultivated. It was essential to prune the vine carefully each year if it was to bear good quality fruit. Thorough pruning took place in the winter, but more gentle pruning continued during the rest of the year. Pruning was designed to remove dead or diseased branches to make room for new growth that would bear healthy rich fruit, ultimately leading to a healthy and productive vine. Caring for a vine

required skill and experience. It is the work of the Father. The vine was a common symbol in the Bible for Israel, the People of God: "You brought a vine out of Egypt, to plant it you drove out nations" (Ps 80:8). Jesus applies this image to the community that he is founding, the church. Its members are branches in him that will bear fruit, but they need to remain part of the vine, drawing life from the sap that runs up from the root to every part of the vine.



SERIES: JUST THREE WORDS

Season colour WHITE

In this series, Clare Gilmore explores the sheer depth contained in 'just three words'.



"Lord help us!" is a commonly heard phrase used to express a kind of dismay, though spoken in a tone of gentle jest rather than derision, eg "Lord help us, she's going to sing!" Our three words this week—"Lord, help me"—come from the Gospel of Matthew (15:15), but they don't come from a place of joviality and slang, rather, they come from a place of need and sincerity.

There are two four-letter words in our phrase: 'Lord' (suggesting glory, majesty, and infinite power); and 'help' (a small word with immense meaning and feeling behind it). The catch, however, comes in the third word – two letters – 'me'. That makes all the difference, Lord, Help, Me.
