We Are Transformed by the Resurrection

Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive.

- 1 Corinthians 15:20, 22

Every Easter we celebrate Jesus' breaking out of the tomb. We proclaim, "He is risen!" just as we did last year and as we will in another twelve months. Easter eggs are gathered. People flock to church. Family dinners are enjoyed. Then it is back to ordinary, everyday life.

Perhaps at some point you have wondered: "What difference does the resurrection of Jesus two thousand years ago really make in our lives today?" We are heartened by the prospect of the life to come but is that it? Is the promise of eternity all we have to celebrate?

Ever since humans first disobeyed God, we have lived under the shadow of death. It impacts every aspect of our existence. We became estranged from God and alienated from one another. No relationship was unaffected. Oppression and injustice abounded. Brother murdered brother. We see this brokenness all around us. We experience it in our lives.


Our loving God, however, was determined that we not live so far from the good life for which we were created. He came to us in Jesus, determined to save us from ourselves and to restore our relationship with himself. The powers of death put up a battle but the resurrection is the sign that the Lord of Life prevailed, for Jesus and for us.

Jesus said, "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10:10) This is the good news of Easter. It is not just about the quantity of life. It is about the quality of our lives, beginning right here and right now. In light of Christ's triumph over the powers of death, everything changes.

When we see that our sins are forgiven, we can come out of the shadows and step into the light of God. When we witness the radical love of God on full display in Jesus Christ, we are emboldened to respond with love toward God, neighbors, and even toward our enemies. The resurrection overcomes our fears and fills us with hope. The risen Christ invites us to let go of deep anger and old hurts and to forgive freely. Because he lives, we can live courageously and generously.

If you look inward with the light of the risen Christ, you will surely see the abundant life that he brings, welling up in you.

Celebrating Easter April 4, 2021


We are celebrating Easter, April 4, 2021. He is risen, He is risen, indeed! This, to me, is the most important celebration in the Christian church. Years back, I sang a song in a church service that had these words, "I am one of the Easter people from now on"...and another line that is, "life's exciting to me".

Think back to the empty tomb that was seen by the women the first Easter morning. Imagine the excitement they must have felt, seeing the stone rolled away, and their Lord's body gone. Those women became the first "Easter people".

Music lifts me up in ways that spoken words never will. And when I can use music to express my feelings about being a follower of Christ, it makes me realize that I am a messenger in my own way.

Last year, I was part of the folks who planned to sing in an Easter cantata to be held at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in Hamler. Unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic cancelled the final practices and the performance. The cantata, Wondrous Love, written by Lloyd Larson, spoke of the Suffering Servant, Crucified Christ, and Risen Redeemer. Through spoken word, and singing, we were going to deliver the message of being Easter people. In order to be Easter people, we must recall the week leading up to Jesus' resurrection. Through our music, we would have delivered the message of the triumphant entry into Jerusalem, "blessed is He!...Hosanna in the highest! Then, singing "The Night Before the Savior Died", we would have sung of the cup Jesus offered, and the broken bread by which we should remember the sacrifice He made. We would have sung of the Lamb who was slain, who bore our sin and pain for us. And, finally, we would have finished with "My Redeemer's Love". The message we would have delivered would have been of Christ's resurrection, the victory over the grave, and His power which has set us free. We were not able to deliver the message in song, but it has remained in my heart.

May you celebrate the victory of Christ's resurrection as Easter people, each and every day!

March 8, 2021

- Meeting was called to order and Pastor Orr led us in prayer.
- Pastor's report: Pastor Orr is still working on figuring out services for Holy Week and Easter. Arrangements still pending because we do not know whether we will still be outside or if we will be able to worship indoors. He is working with Franell and Kevin to get the next Confirmation class in place. Spiritual Council has approved Pastor Orr's request for vacation July 10 through the 18 (will involve 2 Sundays).
- Boiler status clarification: there are no indications of imminent danger of failure.
- Playground Equipment: A small group of interested parents and grandparents has been formed to make recommendations.
- Parsonage: Eaves troughs are sagging or bent because of the heavy snow this winter. The metal roof also contributes to leaves in the gutters. Motion made to move money from Parsonage maintenance fund to install gutters and leaf guards.
- CE Board: They are planning an outdoor Easter Egg hunt, weather permitting, on Easter with April 11 as the rain date.
- Nominating Team: Still need a three year CE Board and three year Evangelism member, also need congregational members for the Nominating Team.
- Prayers and concerns were shared and the meeting was adjourned at 7:53 p.m.

When we do resume indoor worship the same precautions we used last Fall will still be required.
- Upcoming Communion dates: March 7, April 1 Maundy Thursday, April 4 – Easter, May 2, May 23 – Pentecost/ Confirmation, June 6, July 4, August 1, and September 12 – Rally Day.
- Pastor led us in closing prayer focusing on those in need of healing prayers from the congregation and its friends and family.

OUR CHURCH'S WIDER MISSION APRIL MISSION

During the month of April, our mission focus is on Our Church's Wider Mission or more commonly referred to as OCWM. So, you just may be asking yourself what is our church's wider mission? Well, let's take a look using the 5Ws: who, where, what, when, and why.

I'm pretty sure most folks probably will say well, the who is easy. That is the congregation here at St. John's UCC in Holgate. And that is absolutely correct. But wait, that question was too easy. You see, St. John's in Holgate is part of a Wider spectrum of congregations throughout Ohio. Like others, we are part of a Conference of Churches, and it doesn't just stop here in NW Ohio. Those UCC conferences stretch far and Wide, from local communities, to state and interstate conferences, and to national and international levels. So, wait now, does that mean we just answered the where, too?

In short answer yes. When we ask ourselves where is OCWM, it's <u>Wide</u>. From our local small town of Holgate (Shalom), to places like Louisiana (Katrina) and now Texas(Ice/Snow), and every community in between (Washington UCC). Wow, that is just absolutely amazing and kind of awe inspiring. Maybe I should give you a few seconds to let that soak in...you see, OCWM is not just here locally, it's <u>Wider</u>, it's out there, a lot of it we don't see every day. Sure, we may get a glimpse of news on TV or newspaper, but do we really have a grasp of what is happening without being in that situation? Typically, (at least for me) anytime I have ever had to try and put myself in someone else shoes, that situation happened spontaneously.

In other words, hunger happens, disasters happen, youth need a place to feel safe and be welcomed in, and this all can occur at any moment in time, without any warning. These are examples you and I see or have experienced. There are hundreds, thousands, millions more, instances in time, when our support and healing are needed, that we don't see or are aware of. There is no specific when for OCWM. It's everyday, every week, and all year long.

Now, one might think the why of OCWM would be difficult to answer. I mean we have it pretty good at St. John's UCC, here in Holgate. But, that's just it. You, our congregation, have the support and resources to assist in those Wider areas. Places away from here, are affected by disaster, or lack the resources and education for both youth and adults, or needing guidance for seeking pastors, or sorting through conflict within the church. We can take what we have so good and share it with others who are hurting. In retrospect, if we put ourselves in their shoes, would we not be looking elsewhere for help, support, a lending hand? And just like that, what was Our Church's Wider Mission is now that Church's Wider Mission to us!
