

What's Included in Draft Systemwide Ongoing Investment Estimates?

- State Ops, Planning and Performance Tracking: Estimated by DWR (Suggest \$51M annual)
 - DWR Staff and Resources
 - CVFPB Members/Staff and Resources
 - Resource Agency Staff (CDFW, USFWS, NMFS, etc.)
 - Performance Tracking database creation, maintenance and data collection
- Emergency Management: Estimated by DWR and RFMPs (Suggest \$40M annual)
 - Response and preparedness planning
 - Renewed flood fight supplies
 - Training and exercising response teams
- Reservoir Operations: Estimated by DWR and RFMPs (Suggest \$15M annual)
 - FCO/FIO for Oroville and New Bullard's Bar
 - FCO and increased objective releases for multiple San Joaquin reservoirs

Draft Systemwide Ongoing Investments Continued

- Routine Maintenance: Provided by O&M Workgroup and RFMPs (Suggest \$120M annual, now @ \$30M)
 - Mix of RFMP and Workgroup estimates- current, deferred and future (e.g., rodent control, vegetation management, levee, channel, major and minor structure, etc.) including Arrundo removal
 - Why slightly different than OMRR&R Work Group \$130M estimate?
 - Because most all repair, rehabilitation and replacement activities are included in the capital investment estimates, including pipe penetrations

What's Included in Urban, Rural, and Small Community Ongoing Investment Estimates?

- Risk Awareness, Floodproofing, and Land Use Planning
 - Notification campaigns, elevating structures, floodplain mapping: provided by RFMPs and Floodplain Management Effort
- Studies and Analysis
 - Small Community feasibility studies, sediment studies, hydrology analysis: *provided by RFMPs*


