


FWDP PRESIDENT REPORT

President - Connie Alexander

Decoart Americana: Plantation Pine, Hauser Medium Green, Winter Blue, Black, Warm White, Moon Y:ello, Honey Brown, Toffee, Traditional Burnt Umber, Lemonade.

Optional: one shown with watermelon on bottom. If you desire to do this one bring Tomato Red, Deep Burgundy, and zinc

If not at the meeting please send check for \$80 or \$100 to hold your place. Plus \$14 if you want the wood surface.



APPLE PIE BITES

Prep: 15 minutes | Bake: 15 minutes at 400°F Cool: 5 minutes | Makes: 24 bites

INGREDIENTS


- % of a 17.3-oz. pkg. frozen puff pastry sheets (1 sheet), thawed
- 1½ cups finely chopped apples, peeled if desired
- 2 tsp. sugar
- 1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 10 vanilla caramels, unwrapped*
- 3 Tbsp. heavy cream Chopped toasted pecans

Sea salt flakes

PREHEAT oven to 400°F. On a lightly floured surface unfold puff pastry sheet. Roll pastry into a 15x10-inch rectangle; cut into twentyfour 2½-inch squares. Fit each square into a 1¾-inch muffin cup.

STIR together apples, sugar, and cinnamon. Spoon into pastry-lined muffin cups. Bake about 15 minutes or until pastry is golden. Cool 5 minutes in pan. Carefully remove bites from pan.

MEANWHILE, heat and stir caramels and cream over very low heat until melted and smooth. Drizzle bites with caramel sauce and sprinkle with pecans. Sprinkle lightly with sea salt. Serve immediately. March Project Photo


