

Safety is Our Top Priority

Public Safety is our highest priority which is why CALCOMM 9-1-1 Center was established and operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Emergency calls and other wireless devices require different technology to be quickly served. CALCOMM 9-1-1 allows emergency text messaging and wireless communications to be received and dispatched to appropriate emergency service units, without delay. Our dedicated and highly trained staff can provide excellent emergency services communication while offering life-saving medical instructions and accurate public safety information. CALCOMM met every expectation to accurately dispatch fire, police and emergency medical calls effectively and in the fastest response times that are needed today. We are happy to report that the Village of Midlothian has become a member of CALCOMM and will consolidate their police, fire and emergency medical personnel in the coming months.

Our police and fire department workforce are well trained and prepared as first responders in emergency disasters or crisis. Task forces have been created to deal with crisis that require additional law enforcement. We invite all citizens to attend the CAPS (Calumet's Alternative Policing Strategy) meeting held every fourth Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Recreation Center 12426 S. Loomis. This alternative method of policing

was designed to increase lines of communications between the community and police so that together, they could come up with solutions for chronic neighborhood problems. "Together We Can" promotes the cooperation of police, community and village services in fighting crime.

In 2014, the Village Safety Committee was formed and officials adopted the Illinois Public Risk policies to achieve the highest degree of safety and loss control practices for its employees, residents and visitors alike. In conjunction with Calumet Park Public School District 132, the Village participated in exercises during their annual review meeting of each building's emergency and crisis response plans, protocols and procedures.

Our Village continues to make improvements in safety as an integral part of its services to the community.

We look forward to seeing everyone at our Community Parade and Festival on Saturday, August 13 at the Recreation Center!



CALL IF YOU CAN...TEXT IF YOU CAN'T TEXTING TO 9-1-1 TIPS

TEXT TO 9-1-1 Service is quickly being implemented across the country, and the CalComm Regional 911 Center is fully compliant with all wireless carriers and ready to receive text messages for emergency calls.

When texting the 911 Center, there are a important few things that we would like you to remember to make things easier and eliminate delays in getting Emergency Responders to your emergency.

- First, we encourage you to **CALL** into 911 for Emergencies only. All Non-emergencies or information should be directed to the seven (7) digit lines.
- Only TEXT 911 if you are unable to make a VOICE CALL to 911
- As with all text messages, 9-1-1 messages can take longer to receive, can get out of order or may not be received.
- Text-to-9-1-1 is not available if you are roaming.
- A text or data plan is required to place a text-to-9-1-1 unlike dialing into 911 on any cellular phone with or without an active cell plan, you can place a call into 911.
- If texting to 9-1-1 is temporarily unavailable, you will receive a message indicating that texting 9-1-1 is not available and to contact 9-1-1 by other means.
- Photos and videos cannot be sent to 9-1-1 at this time.

- Text-to-9-1-1 cannot be done in group messages
- Do not text and drive!

How to text 9-1-1 in an emergency:

- Enter the numbers "911" in the "To" field
- The first text message to 9-1-1 should be brief and contain the location of the emergency and type of help needed
- Push the "Send" button
- Be prepared to answer questions and follow instructions from the 9-1-1 Dispatcher
- Text in simple words do not use abbreviations
- Keep text messages brief and concise.



Always remember when calling 911 -Call if you can... Text if you Can't! Seconds count in an emergency!

YOU ARE IMPORTANT US, ENROLL IN CODERED TODAY!

Keeping citizens informed is important to us. Please take a moment to enroll in the CODERED by visiting our website at www.calumetparkvillage.org and click the link "Community Notification System." You will be asked to complete the appropriate information to be notified in the event of emergency situations or community alerts. If you are unable to sign-up online, you can contact our Clerk's Office at 708-389-0850.



Village Beautification Should Begin On Your Block!

Summer is here and with the warmer weather, lawn care maintenance is in full effect. Residents are reminded to place yard waste in approved disposable bags by garbage receptacles for refuse pick-up. Please remember that it is prohibited to place leaves and other yard waste (including branches and bushes) by curbs, or to blow/rake leaves and other yard waste into the street. Leaves and yard waste block sewer covers and can cause flooding in many instances. Residents can help protect their property by removing debris from sewer covers while performing maintenance around their property.

It is also prohibited to place your branches and bushes in the alley that have not been cut in lengths of less than four (4) feet and bundled or tied together.

Public Works crews will be out painting curbs on all VERIFIED handicapped parking locations (Blue) and "no parking signs" and hydrant locations (yellow). If you need a handicapped parking sign and painted curb, please contact the Traffic Compliance

Department at 708-926-7346 or 708-926-7347 to submit ALL required information/documentation to be added to the list.

The Public Works Department began Phase 1 of 4 mandated changes by the State of Illinois to upgrade to Manual on all Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). This means that virtually every street sign within the Village of Calumet Park's jurisdiction will be changed to new, high visibility and resolution reflective material. This process should be completed within the next 2 years. This change is being made to assist the visually impaired and to increase the distance of which drivers can see the upcoming signage upon approach.

Important Tips When Buying a House

The purchase of a house is one of the biggest and most important decisions in your life. It is a long term investment and one that will influence your family and your personal life.

You should consider all aspects of your potential new house. School Districts and Parks are of course important for families with kids. Is your house in close proximity to work? You may want to consider the distance from your house if you need to bike or walk. Find out the closest public transportation if taking a train or bus for shopping, work or play.

Once you have selected a house, request a home inspection prior to making an offer. Keep in mind that most home inspections are visual and will not detect all items such as plumbing problems dealing with water service and sewer lines. Seek professional help in those cases. However, getting a home inspection should detect all major components of the house such as foundation, roof, electrical, interior plumbing, HVAC and structural damage.
