1. Alabama signed the No. 1 class. It's the 12th time in the last 13 years the Tide have signed a Top 2 class. Bama brings in a record NINE 5-star players led by EDGE Keon Keeley. 2. Georgia's last 7 recruiting classes have all ranked in the Top 4. This year's No. 2 class has

12 Top 100 players led by 5-star EDGE Damon Wilson.

3. LSU is bringing in 36 new players (25 frosh/11 transfers) and their overall class (frosh and transfers) ranks No. 4. Including last year, Brian Kelly has brought in 67 new players!

4. Tennessee's No. 9 recruiting class is their best finish since 2015. 5-star QB Nico Iamaleava

is their highest-rated QB recruit in the Internet recruiting era (since 2000).

5. 18 of Florida's 20 recruits were listed as 4-stars. The 90% blue-chip ratio (4-star and 5-star

6. After signing the best class ever in 2022, Texas A&M dropped to No. 15 this year. The Aggies also lost 28 players to the transfer portal (most in the country).
7. South Carolina's No. 16 class was their best finish since 2012. They are led by 5-star EDGE Nyckoles Harbor who is also a track stand-out at 6-foot-5 225 pounds.
8. New Auburn head coach Hugh Freeze is bringing in 34 new players (counting transfers). 18 of them grap on the offensive and defensive lines.

11. Ole Miss incoming frosh Suntarine Perkins is the Rebels' highest-rated LB recruit ever. The Rebels lost 26 players to the transfer portal and welcome in 14.

12. Kentucky brings in one of the top transfer QB's in the country in Devin Leary (NC State).

13. A year after signing their best class ever (No. 15), Missouri dropped to No. 33 this year.

14. Vanderbilt finished with the worst recruiting class in the SEC for the 4th time in the last 5 years.

Big Ten Recruiting Notes:

1. Ohio State has signed the Big Ten's top recruiting class in 12 of the last 13 years!

- 2. Penn St signed six of the Top 10 players in the state of Pennsylvania and Virginia.

 3. Despite back-to-back playoff appearances, Michigan did not sign a single recruit in the Top 100!

 4. Michigan St EDGE Bai Jobe is the Spartans' highest-rated recruit since 2014. The Spartans have signed Top 25 classes in back-to-back years for the first time since 2015-16.

 5. Nebraska new head coach Matt Rhule is bringing in 40 new players (No. 29 overall).

- 6. All four of Maryland's 4-star players are on defense led by Rico Walker.
 7. Iowa only signed two of the Top 12 players in the state of Iowa this year.
 8. Illinois' #43 class is their best since 2011. The Illini signed three 4-star players after signing zero in the previous three classes combined.

 9. Minnesota signed six of the top eight players in the state of Minnesota.

 10. Northwestern's No. 46 class was actually their best class in the Internet recruiting era (did

 13. Purdue's frosh class ranks just No. 66 but they do bring in transfer QB Hudson Card.

 14. A year after signing their best class ever (No. 25), Indiana's frosh class ranks just No. 67 (worst since 2010). Tom Allen did sign 18 transfers (No. 10 transfer class).

ACC Recruiting Notes:

1. Miami's No. 7 class was their best finish since 2008. OT Francis Mauigoa is their highest-rated recruit at any position since 2010!

2. Clemson's No. 11 class was their lowest finish since 2017. The Tigers didn't sign a single Top 9 player in the state of South Carolina.

3. Florida State is bringing in 5 of the Top 50 overall transfer players in the country (more than any other school). Head coach Mike Norvell has brought in 35 transfers in the last 3 years.

4. After signing three straight Top 15 classes, North Carolina slipped to No. 29.

5. Jeff Brohm was announced as the new head coach on December 8th and yet Louisville

signed their best class since 2018.

6. Virginia Tech is bringing a solid transfer class led by 4-star Old Dominion WR Ali Jennings.

7. NC State did not sign a single Top 12 player in the state of North Carolina.

8. Pitt has finished outside the Top 50 in back-to-back classes for the first time in the Internet

recruiting era (since 2000).

9. Wake Forest's No. 53 class was their best finish since 2015.

10. Ten of Dukes' Top 14 recruits are on the defensive side of the ball.

11. After signing back-to-back Top 40 classes for the first time since 2007-08, BC slipped to No. 59 this year. Keep an eye on WR Jaedn Skeete.

12. Georgia Tech's No. 61 frosh class was their worst finish since 2013. They do bring in 12 transfers (No. 26 transfer class).

13. Virginia's No. 64 and No. 65 finishes the last two years are their worst in at least 2 decades. 14. Syracuse's No. 83 class was their worst finish since 2009. The Orange haven't signed a 4-star recruit since 2018.

Pac-12 Recruiting Notes:

1. Oregon has signed the best class in the Pac-12 for five straight years.
2. 5-star QB Malachi Nelson is USC's highest rated QB recruit since Matt Barkley in 2009. The Trojans bring in the nation's No. 3 transfer class.
3. Utah's No. 21 class was their best in history. OL Spencer Fano and Caleb Lomu are their two highest rated QB.

6. 5-star QB Dante Moore is UCLA's 2nd-highest rated recruit ever (Jaelan Phillips). The Bruins also bring in the No. 7 transfer class.

7. 4-star QB Brayden Dorman is Arizona's highest-rated QB recruit in 15 years. The Wildcats have signed back-to-back Top 40 classes, the first time they've done that 2005-06. 8. Stanford's No. 45 class was their worst finish since 2013.

9. Arizona St is bringing in 47 new players (frosh/transfers), more than any team in CFB. They are led by 4-star QB Jaden Rashada.

10. Oregon St QB Aidan Chiles is their highest-rated recruit in 11 years. They also bring in

Clemson transfer QB DJ Uiagalelei. The No. 49 class was their best finish since 2013.

11. Washington St lost 17 players to the transfer portal but do bring in 3 transfer WR's.

12. California's 12-man class finished No. 87, their worst ever. However, they do bring in 10

transfers (No. 32 transfer class)

 11. 4-star Safety Mikal Harrison-Pilot is Houston's highest-rated recruit since 2016.
 12. BYU brings in 11 transfers led by QB Kedon Slovis.

 Kansas has gone transfer heavy the last two years signing 25 combined.
 Cincinnati's small 11-man class finished No. 80, their worst finish since 2008. They do bring in 15 transfers (No. 66 overall class).
