What Is Going to Happen?

- Remove the two walls which now frame in the coat room in the main hall.
- Remove the wall at the entry way of the lounge.
- Replace the wall at the entry way of the lounge with movable wood panels. These panels will include a door and a repurposed stained glass window from the original church which has been in hiding in the attic.
- Upgrade the air conditioners in the lounge and church office.
- Install a new display case in the lounge (Made special for us by Cloyce Baker).
- Relocate the coat racks to the elevator foyer. (Yes, there is enough room!)
- Replace all the flooring in the main hall, including restrooms, library, east stairway and elevator room.
- Replace the ceiling tile in the main hall and upgrade the lighting.
- Paint the hall.



How Does it Effect Our Routine!

- The church office will be closed on June 12, 13, & 14 for the remediation of the asbestos in the hall floor. **NO ONE** is to be in the building.
- Beginning June 15th the offices will be located in the downstairs Sunday School wing.
- All entrance to the building on Sundays and during the week will be through Lincoln Street or the elevator.
- Worship will continue in the nave during construction. (This may change if there are any safety concerns)
- Only one restroom (by the nursery) will be available during construction. The main restrooms near the stairs will be closed. Additional restrooms are located in the Sunday School wing. You may use the elevator to the basement and the 5 steps up can be managed with the use of the chair lift.
- Fellowship Hall and the entire downstairs will be available after June 14th for events and meetings.

The renovation is being financed by the use of Endowment "Legacy Gifts" as well three year's worth of interest income from Church Works. (Interest money our Endowment Committee has rolled over in anticipation of this renovation.) All was approved at the Annual Congregational Meeting in January.

We appreciate your patience as we complete this long-awaited project. The plan is to complete the renovation by the end of July. If you have any question please feel free to contact Wayne Dukes at waynedukes@hotmail.com.

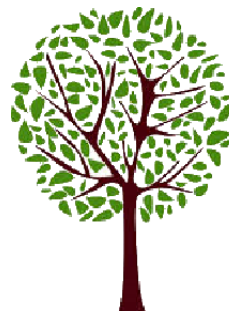

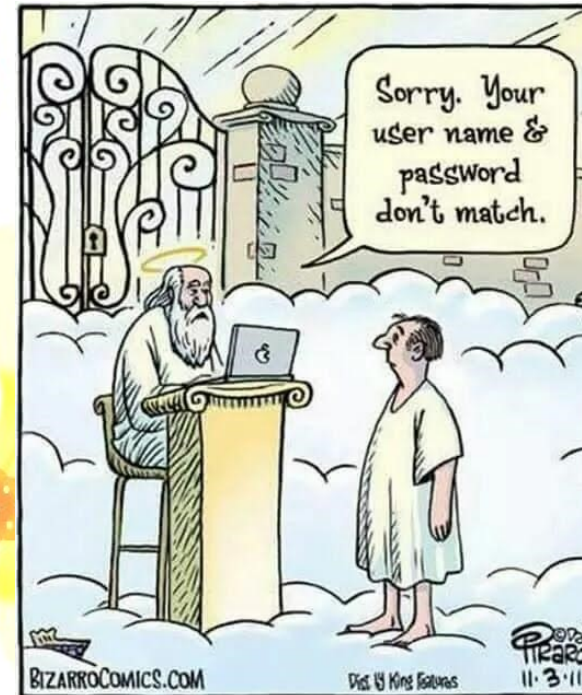

GALATIANS 6:2
CARRY EACH OTHER'S BURDENS, AND IN THIS WAY YOU WILL FULFILL THE LAW OF CHRIST.



Good day, everyone. The rains are over again, the temps might just be warming up. And now we think of picnics, reunions, swimming. Summertime. Yippee!

To begin, I am learning, even as old as I am, that life still turns on a dime. Stronger bifocals, wooden stairs, low light...DANGER, DANGER, DANGER. May 3, I missed the last step, fell, dislocated my shoulder. I was a terrible patient in the ER but all were very kind and understanding. They all knew it hurt.

Now I am learning to be a leftie in a right-handed world. My pantry, linen closet, utensils...are all set up for a right-handed person. Chopping and dicing are difficult as is the whole process of dressing. Try signing a check. Frustration is my constant companion.

Not much else I can do, so I picked a book off my shelf to read the other day – *Along the Way*, by Emilio Estevez and Martin (Ramon Estevez) Sheen. Prior to this book, Emilio directed “The Way,” the movie that follows Martin, portraying a father who finishes his dead son’s walk on the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage in Spain.

As some background information, several years ago, the church book club read *Walk In a Relaxed Manner* by Joyce Rupp; this reading was the first I had ever heard of this trail in Spain. I, of course, was more familiar with our Appalachian Trail. So the research began for the book club. I mentioned at the time to my now-deceased sister Mary Beth about our reading and she said, “Oh my, you should watch “The Way” with Martin Sheen. Real-life father and son portray a father and son living this same pilgrimage in Spain.”

So we watched the movie together. It is, to say the least, very moving. And now I read a book from Mary Beth’s library about the relationship between this real-life father and son before, during, and after the filming. Sheen was 69 when his son and he began this movie. Sheen actually walked the 500 miles of this trail. These two shared an intimate familial world neither had anticipated prior to the filming. Looking back on what I have just written, I sense I don’t do this book justice. So, just read the book and then watch the movie.

Another book I recommend is *Sensible Shoes* by Sharon Garlough Brown. Four women, all in in need of spiritual rejuvenation (aren’t we all at one time or another?), find themselves at the same retreat. The daily lessons center around the questions: Who are you? What do you want? Where have you come from? And where are you going? These questions are not being asked of those just starting a career. These women include everyone’s ages.

The various kinds of prayer are discussed. Even the prayer when we can’t find the words to pray.

New ways of reading the Bible are presented. Some I have never even thought of. One method relies on the imagination...read a story from the Bible several times. Imagine the scene. Put yourself into the scene. Tune into your senses. Now what do you need to do while you are present in this scene? Then think about what you have learned.

Many thoughts and guidelines come out of this text. One insight that speaks to me is the concept that we are all surrounded by burning bushes. We need to figure out just how God is trying to get our attention? Our spiritual life is all about paying attention.

Well, soon the library will be briefly closed. Keep in mind that the rolling cart will have the recent purchases and donations available in the basement.

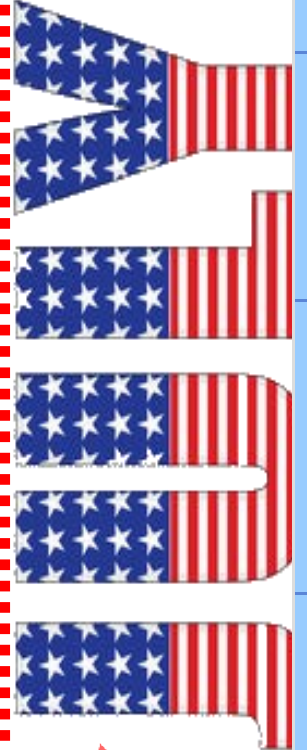
