Making Our Way to Emmaus Again

_____ With Pastor Eric

¹³ Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, ¹⁴ and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. ¹⁵While they

were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, ¹⁶but their eyes were kept from recognizing him. ¹⁷And he said to them, "What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?" They stood still, looking sad. ¹⁸Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, "Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?" ¹⁹He asked them, "What things?" - Luke 24:13-19 (read verses 20-35)

There I was on the top of a bluff at sunset overlooking the fields and cabins of Camp Chrysalis Bible Camp in Kerrville, Texas. I was standing with a pastor mentor of mine trying to discern what God was calling me to do next. We prayed about it for a while and the next thing I knew an hour had passed and I had a sudden feeling of confidence and sense of purpose. How did that happen? I prayed...but there was more to it. My beloved mentor said little during the conversation, but he did ask many questions. He asked a guestion and then reflected what he heard in my reply and then he asked a follow up question. He did not offer any advice or preach at all. It seems that I had the answers and direction inside of me all along. This episode of my life seems to repeat itself with different people and varying circumstances. If I stop to think about it, I imagine that I am not the only one who experiences this form of guidance especially after I read the Emmaus journey story in Luke's gospel.

The two disciples are heading back to Emmaus from Jerusalem on the same day that Jesus arose from the dead. They are grieving, confused and disappointed about the events of those previous three days. They had hoped that Jesus was the one to redeem Israel. What were they going to do now? Suddenly a stranger came alongside them and traveled with them. He began asking questions about what they were discussing and then offered some insight into what the disciples already knew – the story of Israel and God's promises to send a messiah. Later, the disciples invited this new friend to eat with them. Suddenly, a combination of a conversation and meal opened the disciples' eyes to what they already knew inside. This new friend is Jesus! They ran back to tell others about what they experienced and saw... 'Jesus risen from the dead!'

Holy Week and Easter worship takes us into a new season of reflection and new life. We can look back over the past year and take in our grief, disappointments, hopes and dreams and pray to the risen Jesus to help us ask questions about what was learned, gained, and lost. We might realize that deep inside God's Spirit is calling us into something new — a purpose, job, ministry, a relationship, or path to walk? At our council retreat in March, we decided to form a listening team who will ask questions of us as a congregation to consider what God is calling us to right now. We will encounter with "holy curiosity" the Spirit in each of us for the next 7 months. I look forward to having some conversations with you and Jesus as we look into God's promised future. Your support is vital for entering this new season at Palestine.

Let us pray. Almighty God, open our hearts, minds, and souls to your Spirit's voice within and among your people here, so that we might engage each other and discern your call for us at this time and in this place, in Jesus's name. Amen.



From Sheep to Shepherd: An LSI Early Childhood Services Story

Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, a mother, recently released from treatment, found herself in her new empty apartment with her son. She felt lost and needed a shepherd to guide her. So, Hali contacted LSI's Early Childhood Services, and Gretchen O'Brien, a Family Support Worker, answered the call. Gretchen began virtual home visits using the Healthy Family America home-visiting model.

For the next three years, Gretchen connected Hali and her son to community resources, served as a support system and a shoulder to cry on, and celebrated Hali's sobriety milestones with her. Even when Hali doubted herself, Gretchen guided and believed in her.


"I just remember sitting in that empty apartment crying, but I had Gretchen on the phone. You guys believed in me when nobody else did," shared Hali.

Today, Hali serves on the Healthy Family America (HFA) National Parent Advisory Committee, the first of its kind. The group is composed of 10-12 parents from around the country who have graduated from their local HFA program, each participant with their own story to share.

Hali needed a shepherd in her time of trouble and self-doubt, and Gretchen answered that call. Now, Hali serves as a shepherd to thousands of parents through the National Parent Advisory Committee. The LSI Early Childhood team couldn't be more proud of Hali and Gretchen.
