Returning to Normal



Bingo will resume starting Tuesday, July 6th at 10:00am and every Tuesday thereafter at our 187 S. Spring St. location. The long awaited pizza party will take place after Bingo on July 6th.

The Wellness Center hosts various exercise classes throughout the summer. Delay the Disease, an interactive and educational class benefitting those experiencing the onset of Parkinson's' disease or other neurological disorders, takes place on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10 to 11 a.m.

The Wellness Center also offers Chair Yoga on Tuesdays at 11 a.m., as well as Drums Alive on Thursdays at 11 a.m., taught by Danielle Arnett, a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist with a Master of Education degree. Line Dancing takes place on Thursdays at 3:30 p.m.

The gym at the Senior Center is being moved to the Educational and Wellness Center on Radio Lane. Danielle Arnett is developing additional group workouts and fitness classes, to be posted when the gym at the Wellness Center is complete. Some fitness routines are being developed for patients post-cardiac rehab that focus on heart health.

Fellowship, led by Karen Kornmiller, takes place every Wednesdays at 10 a.m. at the Senior Center location on Spring Street. The Senior Center's pool room is available and reservation is no longer necessary (another pandemic

precaution lifted). Choir is starting up again on July 7th, from 1 to 2 p.m. The Center also plans to have a booth Wednesdays at in the Art Hall at the Hocking County Fair.

Moving forward, the Scenic Hills Senior Center and Educational and Wellness Center is back in business. offering various educational and fitness classes, as well as games and fundraising activities. Masks are now optional, but not mandatory. Most fitness classes occur at the Educational and Wellness Center. while most games and activities take place at the Senior Center
