Lillian School Days Recalled

I recently went through a 30-year collection of my mother's in a file cabinet and found a story about the Lillian School reunion, held Feb. 6, 1999, and attended by about 55 of the 100 former students. The school was located near Highway 98 and St. Joseph Catholic Church.

Before this school was built, students were taught in the Lillian Hotel, Gilley school and the Villar school at the Trinkwells.

The main speaker for the reunion was Jimmy Suarez who attended from 1932-40. He became a missionary and travelled from Atlanta to attend. My aunt Dorothy also attended.

Pat Casey, of Irish descent and a retired Army sergeant, saw the need for immigrants and local families to

have a school in Lillian. It began in 1909, and two years later, the Hermecz family moved to land



they purchased between Lillian and Elberta, now Hillcrest U-Pick farm.

My mother, Midge, was born in April 1921 and was the second youngest of the nine children in the Hermecz family. The other siblings were Ethel Hermecz Zollikopfer, Joe Hermecz, Elizabeth Hermecz Dysarczek, Charlie, Jul and Jim. Their father was a trustee of the school along with neighbors A.J. Kreiger and L.L. Lurwig.

Myrtice Hires taught at Lillian School from 1933-1940. She married my uncle Jim and they had three sons. When she talked about teaching Alabama history to fourth graders, she said, "I did not enjoy that one subject that I knew nothing about and cared nothing about."

Virgil Buck was my mother's favorite teacher and when the Intracoastal Canal opened in the early 1930s, he took older students over the bridge and to the gulf to see

it for the first time. She also has photos of the Gulf Shores Hotel built in 1926 with some of classmates enjoying the beach.

Bus drivers in the 1930s included Gerhardt Cassebaum, Joe Trinkwell and Marian Schrott. The bus was really a pickup truck with seats and a canvas top. The Hermecz children walked a mile to the highway after milking cows before breakfast.

The Lillian School eventually moved to Elberta in 1979.


Also in my mother's file was a picture of young George Sunda. His family owned a chicken farm and sold eggs in Pensacola. He once invited my mother to a dance and drove the chicken truck up the muddy road to pick her up. Some of the footboards had wide cracks and by the time they arrived, her dress was splattered with mud. A note written by my mother also mentions George hitchhiking to California to watch Alabama play in the Rose Bowl.

Alabama is celebrating 200 years of statehood and families that came to Baldwin County before 1920 can join a list of over 400 others. A special pin and a certificate will be given to those who register. Registration has been extended and forms can be found in the genealogy and reference department at the Foley Library or from Felecia Anderson in Archives in Bay Minette.

Finding The Path to True Happiness

"Who do you think is happier?" asks Marc Reklau in his book titled Destination Happiness. "People who have won the lottery or people who have become paralyzed after an accident?"

You may be surprised at the answer. "Yes, the lottery winners were very happy, but not for very long," Reklau continues. "After six months they went back to their previous levels of happiness."

On the other hand, "The accident victims were sad, very sad, but surprisingly after six months, they also went back to their previous levels of happiness." Think about that for a moment.

Six months later both had returned to their previous state of happiness. Our circumstances don't determine how satisfied we are with our lives. Something else on the inside makes the difference.

You and I count as part of our heritage the blessings of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. But what is happiness?

Is happiness something that can be obtained by pursuing it? Is it a product of circumstance or surroundings? Is it to be equated with money in the bank, a diploma on the wall, the respect of one's friends and neighbors? Or does it depend on something else, something entirely different? What would it take to make you happy forever?

Jesus talked about happiness in a way that was just as foreign then as it is to us now. He turned our understanding of happiness upside down.

In the Sermon on the Mount, he made some unique and unusual statements about happiness which we know as the Beatitudes. "Happy are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Happy are you who hunger now, for you will be satisfied. Happy are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Happy are you when people hate you, when they exclude you and insult you and reject your name as evil. because of the Son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, because great is your reward in heaven. For that is how their ancestors treated the prophets."

We are more comfortable with the word "blessed" than the word "happy" in these circumstances - but the Greek word makarios, which most translators of the Bible translate as "blessed," is more appropriately translated as "happy or contented." We could see how Mother Teresa, working with dying people in the wretched slums of Calcutta, could be blessed - but happy? And yet people who knew

her most intimately claimed that she radiated happiness and genuine contentment. The truth is the happiest people on earth are not those who pursue happiness, but those who seek God and serve others.

Happiness isn't something that happens to you on the outside, but something that happens on the inside. Happiness is not found in wealth or power or pleasure or a full belly.

A king suffering from a certain sickness was advised he would be cured if the shirt of a contented man were brought for him to wear. People went to all parts of the kingdom and after a long search, they found a man who was truly happy but he didn't possess a shirt. We can have the most desperate of circumstances and still be happy, according to Jesus. Happiness comes from a deeper source.

There are only two sources of happiness in this world. One is a right relationship with God. The other is a right relationship with our fellow human beings. Poverty or wealth, handicap or health, surrounded by loved ones or weeping beside a lonely grave - we can still have a well-spring of joy within, but only if we understand the source of happiness.

Happiness is not dependent upon circumstances, but on an inner certainty that we are loved, accepted and that we belong to God.


A woman was at an art museum viewing paintings of different types of roads. At one end of the big room was a very large painting of a road. It had an ethereal, spiritual look, with soft pastel colors, and the caption beneath it read: "The Road to Happiness."

Two fashionably dressed, middle-aged women walked up beside her. One of them was visibly moved by the painting. "Isn't that beautiful?" she said. But the other responded sadly, "Of course it's beautiful. The only problem is, there's no such road!"

FHP reports Burdeaux pulled


