### **Course Offerings**

Courses are open to qualifying Grade 8 Students via the Reach Ahead program.

#### **The Jewish Identity**

Course Code: *HRE13*<u>Prerequisites:</u> *None* 

Students enrolled in this course will investigate concepts around dedication to Judaism and Jewish studies. Students will explore what it means to be Jewish, the importance of each individual within Judaism, and how to interact with the Jewish community. Students will explore how Jewish ideals, such as Chesed (kindness) and Tzedakah (charity), are of paramount importance to the Jewish people and the global community. Students will work to develop an appreciation for their respective communities and for their community leaders.

#### Theoretical & Applied Ethics

Course Code: *HRE23*Prerequisites: *None* 

This course invites learners to inquire around the timeless relevance of Jewish ideals. Students will be introduced to foundational Jewish beliefs, and will discover relevant applications of Jewish theology to modern social and ethical dilemmas. Students will be challenged to apply critical thinking and problem-solving skills to observe how Judaism relates to the fields of medicine, business, law, as well as the family unit. Students will also explore the significance of classical Rabbinical Judaism as it relates to past, present and future.

#### **Scriptures through History**

Course Code: *HRE33*Prerequisites: None

This course will provide students with a deeper understanding of the Hebrew Bible and its Rabbinic commentaries. Through the study and application of classical Jewish texts to modern experiences, students will succeed in forming an attachment to their heritage. A secondary course focus will include an exploration on Jewish history, geographical-specific Jewish cultures, and traditions associated with everyday Jewish life.

#### Sociology, Anthropology, Psychology (SAP) - University Preperation

Course Code: HSP3U

<u>Prerequisites:</u> Grade 10 English Academic or Grade 10 History Academic

This course introduces the theories, questions, and issues that are the major concerns of anthropology, psychology, and sociology. Students will develop an understanding of the way social scientists approach the topics they study and the research methods they employ. Students will be given opportunities to explore theories from a variety of perspectives and to become familiar with current thinking on a range of issues that have captured the interest of classical and contemporary social scientists in the three disciplines.

#### **Philosophy: Questions and Theories - University Preparation**

Course Code: *HZT4U* 

<u>Prerequisites:</u> Any university or university/college preparation course in Social Sciences and Humanities, English, or Canadian and World Studies.

This course addresses three (or more) of the main areas of philosophy: metaphysics, logic, epistemology,



ethics, social and political philosophy, and aesthetics. Students will learn critical-thinking skills, the main ideas expressed by philosophers from a variety of the world's traditions, how to develop and explain their own philosophical ideas, and how to apply those ideas to contemporary social issues and personal experiences. The course will also help students refine the tactics they use in researching and investigating topics in philosophy.

#### **Introduction to Hebrew Language**

Course Code: LY1AD <u>Prerequisites: None</u>

This course will equip students with the skills necessary to communicate with native speakers of modern Hebrew. In addition to reading age & language appropriate passages, students will explore various aspects of Israeli culture, social customs & native arts. Students will participate in cultural events and activities, and utilize technology to link language with culture.

**Note**: This course is offered **only** on the following schedule: **3 PM - 3:45, Monday through Friday, Daily.**

- Classes (excluding LY1AD) run on Tuesday evenings, from 5 PM through 7:30 PM. Unless
  otherwise notified via your registered school email address (or stipulated in the 2018-2019
  schedule) Hamilton Hebrew High will facilitate classes at this time.
- Hamilton Hebrew High reserves the right to cancel a particular course due to insufficient enrollment. In the event of this circumstance, students enrolled in the cancelled course will be offered (i) the opportunity to participate in another Hamilton Hebrew High course, or (ii) a tuition refund.
- Hamilton Hebrew High courses comply with Ministry of Education policies and guidelines, in which there is a minimum of 110 hours of instruction, in accordance with Ontario Secondary Schools Program Diploma Requirements. 80 of these hours are designated to be completed through two hour classroom sessions, while the remaining 30 hours are to be completed through course-relevant Experiential Learning Programs. Examples include independent study projects, seminars, scheduled community events and weekend retreats. Hamilton Hebrew High students recognize that attendance at Experiential Learning



*Programs* is a necessary requirement towards course completion. Experiential learning programs not facilitated by or through Hamilton Hebrew High will not be recognized of considered eligible for the requisite 30 hours towards course completion.

## **Tuition Requirements**

- The tuition cost for each course is \$900.00 (taxes included), with the exception of LY1AD, which is \$250.00. This cost includes payment to specific *Experiential Learning Programs*, but not all. *Experiential Learning Programs* that have an additional cost will explicitly state that cost in the program advertisement.
- Tuition is due in full at the beginning of the school term. Students may speak with the principal to arrange alternative payment methods, if necessary.
- Scholarships are available on an availability and as-per-needs basis. Students interested in applying for a scholarship should complete the package attached to this document, and submit it prior to the tuition payment due date.
- All payments must be submitted through one of the following avenues, with no exceptions:
  - Personal cheque made to *Hamilton Hebrew High*, and submitted with this registration package.
  - o Credit Card (Mastercard or Visa) by calling 416-230-0242 and arranging payment.
- If a student wishes to discontinue a course, a full tuition reimbursement will be
  offered, provided that the Hamilton Hebrew High office is notified before the
  commencement of the fourth class of that course. No exceptions will be made.
- Tuition fees may be eligible for a charitable tax reduction.
- Hamilton Hebrew High is a beneficiary agency of the *Hamilton Jewish Federation*.
