Kelvin Brown was born in Cordele, Ga and raised in Lithonia, Ga. In 2008 he moved to Murfreesboro, TN where he became inspired by the beautiful geography of TN.

He graduated from two prestigious HBCU's. He holds a BA in Sociology from Albany State University, and a Master's of Social Work from Tennessee State University.

Today, Mr. Brown is a Behavioral Clinician at Community Health Systems in which he conducts evaluations for patients who arrive in the emergency room in crisis of the mental health scope to help determine the need for inpatient treatment, or discharge home with a safety plan with outpatient resources. Prior to CHS, he spent several years working as a therapist in three of the state prisons in TN where he conducted mental health treatment for clients with serious and persistent mental illnesses. During his tenure, he managed the 7D Level Four Intensive Inpatient Behavioral Health Simulation Unit where he developed and implemented an incentive-based pilot program which was the first of its kind designed to encourage the use of proper coping skills as well as promoting utilization of interpersonal skills among patients. The program's goals are to transition patients into a less restrictive population and provide tools to facilitate a successful transition back into society.

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Mr. Brown is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker who specializes in interpersonal relations and reality testing. He also utilizes various evidenced based practices that are tailored to the clients' needs while meeting them where they are in their journey. He utilizes structures that include individual, couples, family, alternative relationships, and/or process groups. He is licensed to practice clinically in Tennessee, Florida, Indiana, Pennsylvania, Arizona, and Virginia, and has a private practice located in the heart of the Nashville Black Community.

He is an avid supporter of the needs, culture, and outlook of the African American community, while operating within an African Centered framework. Mr. Brown enjoys studying, teaching, and implementing Ancient African history. He recently traveled to Accra, Ghana during the Year of Return.

He has two godchildren who are dear to his heart. In his spare time, he loves to travel, enjoy the arts, explore music, and spending time with family & friends as well as his love for chicken wings and collard greens.
